Body

The purpose of this item is to consider requests to carry over certain unexpended and unencumbered budgets from FY2016 to FY2017.

Carryover Requests

When Council adopted the FY2017 budget, they also approved continuing appropriations for: a) all valid encumbrances outstanding at June 30, 2016; b) all unexpended and unencumbered, previously approved project budgets at June 30, 2016; c) all unexpended and unencumbered previously approved pavement preservation budgets at June 30, 2016; d) all unexpended and unencumbered previously approved budget for Fire Mitigation; and e) all unexpended and unencumbered grant budgets at June 30, 2016 that are permitted to be carried forward by their governing grant agreements. The request to carry over budgets for the other unexpended and unencumbered items was deferred until now in order to refine the amounts being requested.

Alternatives

Council could choose not to approve some or all of the attached carryovers and revisions. The impact would be that the related projects or programs may not occur or existing operations may be negatively impacted in FY2017.

Title

Adoption of Property Tax Rates for Calendar Year 2016 as Certified by the State Department of Finance and Administration.

Recommended Action

I move that Council adopt the official 2016 Certificate of Property Tax Rates prepared by the State Department of Finance and Administration, Local Government Division shown in Attachment A and forward notification of this adoption to the County Assessor.

County Manager's Recommendation

The County Manager recommends that Council approve the certificate of property tax rates as requested.

Body

In accordance with 7-3-38, NMSA 1978, the State of New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) must calculate and certify property tax rates for all taxing entities within the State by September 1 of each year. The attached copy of the Certificate of Tax Rates from DFA (Attachment A) provides the 2016 property tax rates as calculated for all governmental units within the County sharing in the total tax levy and in accordance with the Property Tax Code.

The state statutes (7-38-34, NMSA, 1978) require that within five days of receipt of the order, the Board of County Commissioners (our County Council) must issue a written order imposing the tax at the rates certified by DFA and set the net taxable value of property allocated to the appropriate governmental units. A copy of that order is to be delivered immediately to the County Assessor for preparation of the tax schedule before October 1st.

Attachment B compares changes in the residential and non-residential mill levy rates for tax years 2015 and 2016. The total levied residential rate decreases by .056 mills, or -.23%, and the total levied non-residential rate increases by .079 mills or .29%. The main factor contributing to the rate changes is the State's application of the "yield control" formula that controls the actual change in tax revenue growth (see Attachment C for a full discussion of this process).

The net assessed valuation of residential property increased \$10,156,850 or 1.7% from

\$580,968,810 in 2015 to \$591,125,660 in 2016. Non-residential assessed valuation decreased by \$2,547,486 or -2.6% from \$98,814,305 in 2015 to \$96,266,819 in 2016. Attachment B also shows examples of the total taxes due on various levels of property within the County. Individual taxpayers should not assume that their tax bills will change by the same percentage shown on attachment B because changes in individual property valuation are not constant and will affect individual tax bills.

Alternatives

State law does not appear to provide an alternative to this Council action.

Fiscal and Staff Impact/Planned Item

Attachment B shows County total revenue projected from these rates to be \$6,960,660 based upon a 99% collection factor. After the schedule is delivered, the Accounts Receivable staff will prepare tax bills and mail them before November 1, 2016. The first installment of the bills becomes delinquent after December 10, 2016 and the second installment after May 10, 2017. These are normal work items in the Assessor's Office and the Finance Division.

Property Taxes Imposed Rates vs. Levied Rates September 2016

Over the years there has been much discussion and misunderstanding of how property tax rates are established. This memo is intended to clarify this issue and make it easier to understand why property tax rates may fluctuate from year to year.

State Statutes set the upper limit on how many mills of property tax a local entity may impose. See the table below for those limits. For purposes of this document, mills *imposed* will refer to the mills that are voted on and approved by the local legislative body (i.e. County Council). Changes to the imposed rate for the County can only be done by the Council in a formal manner. The last change to the mills imposed by Los Alamos County was done in the spring of 2015 as part of the adoption of the FY16 Annual Budget. This change resulted in an increase of 2.25 mills. The table below also shows the current mills *imposed* to be 8.850 for County and 3.998 for the Municipal portion for a total of 12.848. Note that the total maximum operating mills allowed by State statute is 19.500 for Los Alamos. Also, by State statute, the rates for Residential and Non-Residential property must be *imposed* in equal increments.

For this discussion the mills *levied* refers to the actual millage rate, which is certified annually by DFA after the application of "yield control", as required by State statutes. This levied rate is adopted by the Council and is used for preparation of the annual property tax bills that are sent to taxpayers. Yield control limits property tax revenue growth resulting from revaluation to a rate determined annually by DFA from an independent inflation index. Other sources for revenue growth (e.g. new construction valuation or new operating mills imposed by the legislative body or G.O. bond mill levies like the one approved by the voters for the Los Alamos Public School in 2009) are not limited in the same manner.

Whenever the valuation growth exceeds the growth rate allowed by DFA, the yield control formula adjusts the *levied* rate downward so that the actual resulting revenue yield growth is limited to the independent inflation factor. [For many years this was the case for Los Alamos residential property – this is why the levied rate is lower than the rate actually imposed.] Conversely, when valuation growth is less than the growth rate allowed by DFA, the yield control formula will adjust the *levied* rate upward. The upward adjustment is still limited by the revenue yield growth rate allowed by DFA and will occur only as long as the *levied* rate is less than the *imposed* rate.

The final budget for your local government entity for Fiscal Year 2017, as approved by your governing body, has been examined and reviewed. The Department of Finance and Administration, Local Government Division (LGD) finds it has been developed in accordance with applicable statutes and budgeting guidelines, and sufficient resources appear to be available to cover budgeted expenditures. Therefore, in accordance with NMSA 1978, Section 6-6-2 (E) (2011), the LGD certifies your entity's final Fiscal Year 2017 budget.

Please take note that state statute requires all revenue sources be expended only for public purposes, and if applicable, in accordance with the Procurement Code, Chapter 13, Article 1, NMSA 1978. Use of public revenue is governed by Article 9, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of New Mexico, commonly referred to as the anti-donation clause.

Budgets approved by the LGD are required to be made a part of the minutes of your governing body according to NMSA 1978, Section 6-6-5 (1957). In addition, NMSA 1978, Section 6-6-6 (2001) provides that the approved budget is binding on local officials and governing authorities; and any official or governing authority approving claims or paying warrants in excess of the approved budget or available funds will be liable for the excess amounts.

Finally, as required by NMSA 1978, Section 6-6-2 (H) (2011), LGD is required to approve all budget increases and transfers between funds not included in the final approved budget.

Title

Consideration of the FY2018 - FY2022 State Infrastructure and Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) Submission

Recommended Action

I move that Council approve the submission to the State of the ICIP as attached. County Manager's Recommendation

The County Manager recommends that Council approve the ICIP as presented.

Body

The County is required to prepare and submit an Infrastructure and Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) to the State by September 1, 2016. The County was granted an extension to submit by September 16, 2016. Generally, a project must appear on this list if the County expects to have any State funding considered for that project. Listing a project in the ICIP does not guarantee funding from the State, nor does this document constitute an application for funding. With limits in State revenues, very little consideration will be given to projects beyond the top five listed. Most legislative grants are expected to be in small amounts.

Several things must be noted about the rankings in the State's ICIP. First, the State's ICIP is a five-year plan. The top five projects for next year were chosen based on Council goals, discussions with County staff, necessity of the project, importance of the project based on previous discussions with Council and the Public, and potential for funding from the State. The ICIP includes all Utility Capital Projects and all General County Capital Projects that have been through the County's CIP process. Studies are not listed. Excluding the top five projects, all other projects are in no particular ranking. The State proscribed format for the top five projects is attached.

Alternatives

Council could choose not to approve the submission, which could limit the County's ability to receive State funding. Council could also choose a different top five projects or change the order of the ranking.

Fiscal and Staff Impact/Planned Item

The submission of the ICIP to the State enables the County to request project funding from the State and may reduce the amount of local funds required for the projects.

I am a former resident of Los Alamos who is moving home with my family after living elsewhere for the last 15 years. I'd like to reconnect to Los Alamos and get involved in the community. As a mom now, my perspective on Los Alamos has changed from when I lived there as a high schooler- I've always loved the libraries in Los Alamos and I would enjoy helping the libraries serve the public better. Being a returning resident to Los Alamos means that I will have a fresh perspective, with respect for the libraries' histories and the community's heritage.

2. What volunteer or professional activities have you participated in that could apply to this appointment?

Following college, I served in the US Peace Corps in Ethiopia for two years as an HIV AIDS volunteer. Integral to this position is capacity building and gaining the public's input and cooperation. My job was to provide what the community needed, as such, I learned to spend a majority of my time researching what was needed, prior to planning and implementing a program. I think this experience could help me stay focused on Los Alamos' community's needs. In order to be successful, everything should be backed by the community.

Additionally, my most recent employment was at Texas Children's Hospital, where I worked as a systems analyst with their medical record. This was a highly data driven position where we tracked needs, changes, and success of new features. I think this perspective and my experience organizing changes and feedback would be applicable as well.

Having a young child, I'm quite interested in ensuring programming is meeting the needs of families and children. I know both libraries already have fantastic programming for this need, but keeping up with demand and ensuring the libraries are flexible enough to accommodate changes when necessary would be important to me. Introducing new programs, maybe an art display for children would be of interest to mebut I would like for the community to have the biggest say in what's needed.

Finally, having some technical experience, I'd like to assist in keeping the libraries' surveys and tracking tools up to date. Perhaps a computer kiosk for library feedback at the exit would be beneficial or using

survey monkey for surveys in lieu of (some or all) paper surveys. I believe in working smarter, not harder and would enjoy finding new solutions or improving current methods.
