Item 10483-18 - Crosswalk at Broadview

It is proposed that a crosswalk be installed on the north side of the intersection (with associated signage), the existing curb ramp be brought into compliance and another curb ramp be installed on the west side of Broadview Drive. Adjacent to the curb ramp on the west side of Broadview Drive, a bus loading pad would also be installed (see exhibit). The proposed work would encourage students to cross at the crosswalk (with the encouragement and coaching of police staff, schools staff and parents) and improve the ADA accessibility in the area. Once the work is completed, the bus stop would be moved to the south to the newly constructed student loading area, improving site visibility of the bus stop in general.








Boarding and Alighting in Los Alamos November 1, 2017 – February 15, 2018

Bus Stop Improvement Plan

Approved by the Transportation Board on ______, 2018

Purpose

The purpose of this plan is to provide a comprehensive inventory of bus stops and associated amenities and to prioritize needed and desired improvements, system-wide, in Los Alamos Townsite and White Rock.

This plan serves as a guiding document for Los Alamos County – Atomic City Transit and is a living document that is subject to change. The bus stop improvement plan focuses on stop accessibility, increasing passenger amenities, and design consistency.

The plan shall:

- 1. Establish an inventory of bus stop locations with associated passenger amenities
- 2. Identify usage at existing bus stops using the boarding/alighting survey
- 3. Identify areas of concerns related to ADA access as well as prioritize opportunities for improvement based on ridership

Existing Conditions

Exhibit 1 provides a detailed list of bus stop locations, numbers, current conditions, and current passenger amenities.



Bus Stop Spacing

Currently the bus stop spacing is generally one quarter of mile or 5 city blocks from one stop to another. In high density residential or in commercial locations the spacing is less than the national standard stated above.

It is recommended this current spacing continue to be utilized.

Below is an example of the spacing between stops for Route 1 – Los Alamos Downtown area.



Design

Currently, Atomic City Transit uses several different vendors for bus shelter and benches. Although they may look similar there are some slight differences. The benches used throughout the system are different dependent of when they were purchased, donated and installed. These are some examples of current shelter and benches.

ADA Accessibility

In accordance with Department of Transportation (DOT) American with Disabilities Act (ADA) Standards for Transportation Facilities, the following criteria from the DOT's ADA standards indicate that compliance is required to the extent construction specifications are within a public entity's control.

The Americans with Disabilities Act is intended to assure public areas are accessible for persons with disabilities to include the pathway to bus stops, within the bus stop area itself, and the access onto the bus.

Department of Transportation requirements for Transportation Facilities – Federal ADA Compliance

810.1 General. Transportation facilities shall comply with 810.

810.2 Bus Boarding and Alighting Areas. Bus boarding and alighting areas shall comply with 810.2.

Advisory 810.2 Bus Boarding and Alighting Areas. At bus stops where a shelter is provided, the bus stop pad can be located either within or outside of the shelter.

810.2.1 Surface. Bus stop boarding and alighting areas shall have a firm, stable surface.

810.2.2 Dimensions. Bus stop boarding and alighting areas shall provide a clear length of 96 inches (2440 mm) minimum, measured perpendicular to the curb or vehicle roadway edge, and a clear width of 60 inches (1525 mm) minimum, measured parallel to the vehicle roadway.

In a comprehensive review of ACT stop locations the most common issues identified (where our infrastructure falls shorts of the ADA standards)

- 1. Bus stops located adjacent to an existing sidewalk yet lacking connection to sidewalk (across curb strip currently composed of gravel, dirt or grass). Specifically, 33 stops needing such connections (6 of which are located on current 2 Peak alignment).
- 2. In addition, 24 stops were identified as not having paved sidewalks adjacent to the stop, but rather yards that run to the edge of the street, requiring access to the stop from the street. These stops do not currently have accessible landing pads that permit access from the street or other firm, stable path of access.

The focus of the implementation plan will be to address those stops that do not comply with the above criteria.

Classification - Prioritization for Improvements

The following classifications have been assigned to the bus stops prioritized for improvements according to the following criteria:

First priority should be given to Category 1 and Category 2 stops identified as non-ADA compliant.

Second priority should be given to Category 3 includes placement of additional passenger amenities based on usage at the stop (based on boarding and alighting survey performed November 2017 through February 2018).

Category 1	Priority 1	Comply with ADA requirement for pathway to bus stops – install connections to existing sidewalks
Category 2	Priority 1	Comply with ADA requirement for accessible pathway to bus stops – add landing pad with accessible connection to pathway
Category 3	Priority 2	To include bus shelter, and/or bench, and/or trash receptacle, and/or bike rack

Recommended Implementation Program

Staff would recommend prioritizing the 33 identified stop locations in need of connections to sidewalks as the initial phase of the improvement program.

The second phase of the improvement program would focus on the 24 stops that need an accessible connection to the bus stop as well as an accessible landing pad.

The final phase of the program would be to identify and install passenger amenities, to include bus stop shelters, benches, bike racks, trash receptacles, among the 50 most used bus stops based on usage of the stop and particular characteristics of the location.

Exhibit 1 is a complete inventory of Atomic City Transit bus stops.

Exhibit 2 is a reduced list to include 50 of the most used bus stops as well as stops that have been identified as Priority level 1 and 2.

Exhibit 3 is a list of 50 most used bus stops within the ACT service area.

Budget and Implementation

The Transit Division has allocated approximately \$20,000 to begin bus stop improvements in FY2019 (beginning July 1, 2018). Additional monies shall be requested in the FY 2020 budget year to complete the project.

Other Programs Recommendations

Future considerations should include developing a partnership with the Art in Public Place program, as well as potential bicycle rent/share program, with focus on incorporating public art at stop locations and encouraging the practice of combining bike/bus modes for passenger trips.

As well as establishing guidelines for types and designs of passenger amenities to assure standardization throughout the ACT service area.





ADA Accessibility

In a comprehensive review of ACT stop locations the most common issues identified (where our infrastructure falls shorts of the ADA standards)

- 1. Bus stops located adjacent to an existing sidewalk yet lacking connection to sidewalk (across curb strip currently composed of gravel, dirt or grass). Specifically, 33 stops needing such connections (6 of which are located on current 2 Peak alignment).
- 2. In addition, 24 stops were identified as not having paved sidewalks adjacent to the stop, but rather yards that run to the edge of the street, requiring access to the stop from the street. These stops do not currently have accessible landing pads that permit access from the street or other firm, stable path of access.



Staff Recommendations

Staff recommends prioritizing the 33 identified stop locations in need of connections to sidewalks as the initial phase of the improvement program.

The second phase of the improvement program would focus on the 24 stops that need an accessible connection to the bus stop as well as an accessible landing pad.

•The final phase of the program would be to identify and install passenger amenities, to include bus stop shelters, benches, bike racks, trash receptacles, among the 50 most used bus stops based on usage of the stop and particular characteristics of the location.

Administration Division

Transportation Board



The Transportation Board meets the first Thursday of the month at 5:30 p.m. Meetings are held at 1000 Central Avenue, Room #110.

Airport Division

Based aircraft update



Angel Flight

The FAA requires airports update their list of based aircraft annually. The FAA uses this data to determine grant eligibility and track aircraft registrations. Based on the update, Los Alamos County Airport is home to 60 aircraft: 58 single-engine, 1 twin-engine and 1 helicopter. Two of the single-engine aircraft belong to the local Civil Air Patrol (CAP) Squadron – they provide aerial search and rescue, disaster relief, and flight and leadership training for local youth. The helicopter is operated by Classic Air – they provide rapid medical air transportation and search and rescue serves. The airport is also

home to a chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association – they provide free introductory flights to local youth though the Young Eagles program. And many of the aircraft owners are Angel Flight volunteers – they provide free air transportation for people who need to travel to receive lifesaving

medical treatment, but lack the means. The airport also serves as an aerial firefighting support base for the US Forest Service and an emergency air transportation facility for LANL.

Airport Engineering, Architectural & Planning Services Request for Qualifications (RFQ)

The County issued a RFQ for Airport Engineering, Architectural and Planning Services as is required by the FAA. These services will be used for Capital Improvement Projects as contemplated in the Airport Master Plan with grant funding from the FAA, NMDOT and the County. The County is reviewing qualified responses and selection, contract negotiations and execution is expected in early April.



Storm Water Pollution Prevention Program (SWPPP) Improvement.

A local contractor completed erosion repairs on Pueblo Canyon Trail and made improvements to the storm





water outflow from the airport to prevent future erosion. These improvements will help to mitigate silt transport to tributaries, streams and waterways from airport storm water runoff and ensure compliance with airport's SWPPP obligations.

Custodial Division

The Custodial Division supported 226 events during the month of March.

Installation of the Green Cleaning dispensers for chemicals and paper products continued this month with expected completion in April.

Fuller Lodge Sound System





The new sound system for Fuller Lodge was installed this month and we have already received compliments on how much easier it is to hear lectures and concerts and how much the sound quality has improved. The previous speakers will still be available for anyone wanting to plug them into their receivers or amps.

Candyman Limited installed a new sound system in the Pajarito and Ante Rooms at Fuller Lodge to provide better sound quality for presentations.

The hearing loop was also extended to the Ante Room area. Tim Martinez from Facilities lent his artistic wood-working qualities to the project and built a beautiful wood cabinet to house all the equipment matching the rustic design of the lodge – Thanks Tim!

The golf course patio was refinished the week of March 26.

Engineering & Project Management Division

New Aircraft Hangar Construction

Construction is set to move forward utilizing in-house personnel comprised of Facility and Traffic and Streets staff. Dan Erickson and Anthony Strain are providing oversite on the project. Currently Eric Edmonds of Risk is helping implement safety training to update all personnel involved in the project. A tentative start date has been set for April 9th and continue through the end of May 2018.

Server Room Cooling Improvements

The improvements to the server room cooling saw the completion of the installation of the separation curtains last month. Changes to the controls, thermostats, and modifications to the condensing units are planned for late March.

Kiddie Pool Project

The RFP for design was advertised on March 8th, proposals are due March 21st. The selection committee comprising of Community Services and Public Works staff will make their recommendation for a May 2018 Council award.

Mesa Library Fire Panel Replacement

Acceptance testing took place February 23rd and passed. The installation of Exit signs is pending, and is on track to be complete before the late April Final Completion date.

Historic Museum Carpet

Dominguez Carpet installed specialized carpet in the north gallery area. The floor in this area had cracked shortly after construction was completed and for aesthetics carpet was requested, prior to construction the area had carpet as well.

Fire Station 6 Restroom Remodels

Chief Hughes requested that the restrooms at Fire Station 6 (Airport) be remodeled as it has been a little over 10 years since they were last re-done and are in need of work. A task order with an on-call architect is in process to begin design work. It is anticipated that construction could begin in July 2018.

Fire Station 3

Architectural design plans are complete and bid advertisement is scheduled for late February with contract award May 2018. The project includes reroofing, as well as a new wall system, window replacement and HVAC system modifications to better insulate and control the temperature in the bunkrooms. Construction is anticipated from June 2018 through the fall.

Mesa Library HVAC Improvements

The current system is an evaporative cool system, while a less expensive system to install and operate. However, it does not provide adequate cooling during times of high (30% plus) humidity. The system itself is limited in its cooling capacity due to its original design and half of the required air flow capacity for an evaporative system. The design consultant evaluated several system options which included an initial and life-cycle cost analysis. This evaluation resulted in a system that was selected for design.

An Invitation for Bids to install the new system is scheduled for a March advertisement, with an anticipated Council award May 1. This schedule will provide the contractor ample time for approval and ordering of equipment so that work can commence in August.

Since the building cannot be occupied during the work, the library is scheduled to be closed from August 20th through November 29th. Public Works and Community Services Department staff are working closely to plan improvements and provide alternative accommodations to the public so that library services are maintained during this time.

Landfill - Gas Extraction and Control System

Engineering and Environmental Services staff have worked with Stearns, Conrad and Schmidt Consulting Engineers (SCS Engineers), an engineering consultant to develop design plans for a permanent gas extraction system for the landfill to comply with New Mexico Environment Department methane gas limits.

The Project consists of the installation and construction of a Landfill Gas Collection System at the closed landfill to prevent subsurface landfill gas migration off the landfill property in accordance with New Mexico Environmental Department regulations. The project will include the installation of two (2) systems, which will either destroy the gas in an open flare or vent it to the atmosphere. Both systems have been designed to disburse any emissions above ground level, whereas the open flare system will also combust any potential pollutants.

The permanent extraction system project was advertised for construction in December, Council awarded a bid on February 27th to American Environmental Group with SCS oversite for \$1,281,490.

Notice to Proceed was given to the contractor on March 14th, with an anticipated start of construction on April 16th. The Substantial Completion date is August 1, 2018 with a Completion date of August 22, 2018.

Canyon Rim Trail Phase 3

The easements for DOE property along the preliminary alignment have been drafted and are in the process of being executed. The County will continue discussions with the adjacent land owners along the trail corridor for easements along the proposed alignment between Knecht Street and the 20th Street Extension.

Canyon Rim Trail Underpass

The project was awarded federal FY2018 funding under the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) for project study and design in the amount of \$320,000 and FY2020 TAP funding for project construction in the amount of \$2,020,000 for a total award of \$2,340,000.

The NMDOT concurred with awarding the project to the County's selected consultant, Wilson and Company. A task order has been issued and a kick-off meeting has been scheduled for April to begin preliminary design work.

North Mesa Phase 2 Improvements (Cumbres del Sol Subdivision)

Staff is working on the contract and plans for improvements to Camino Manzana/Mora/Cereza. Estimated construction is to begin in mid-June. Scope of work is for the rehabilitation of Camino Manzana/Mora/Cereza. This includes the reconstruction of the asphalt surface and limited concrete replacement (sidewalks, curb and gutter, drive pads and ADA curb ramps at designated locations. The public meeting was held on March 1st during the presentation to the Transportation Board.


- NM 4/East Jemez Rd. (Truck Route) Intersection: Staff continues to work with DOE, NMDOT Bandelier, and Army Corps of Engineers to program, design and construct intersection upgrades to improve capacity and safety. A meeting to discuss the design of this project took place on March 21st.
- NM 502 Reconstruction, Knecht St. to Tewa Loop: Staff continues to coordinate with NMDOT on this state lead project. NMDOT bid the project for a third time on December 15th and received no bidders. The County awaits further information from NMDOT management on the future of the project. It is anticipated to rebid in the fall of 2018 for a January 2019 award date.

Environmental Services Division

Los Alamos County Landfill Gas (LFG) Update

This is a summary of results for February 2018 methane monitoring for the Los Alamos County closed landfill.

- 1. The LFG Vents ranged in methane concentrations from 44.7 (LFG Vent 7) to 59.4 (LFG Vent 1) percent gas in air.
- 2. The gas probes near the toe of the landfill materials ranged in methane concentrations from 2.3 (MP-12) to 51.4 (MP-8) percent gas in air.
- 3. The gas probes near the boundary of the landfill ranged in methane concentrations from 2.4 (MP-8R) to 33.0 (MP-10R) percent gas in air.



Curbside Yard Trimmings Roll Cart



Online registration is now open for the curbside yard trimmings roll cart program. The yard trimmings roll cart program will begin July 2018. To date Environmental Services has received over 1,500 registration entries for a roll cart, this is over 20% of the residential customer base. By implementing the yard trimming roll cart, Los Alamos residents have an opportunity to divert 14% of our waste stream from the landfill each year. The diversion efforts have the potential to divert 1,107 tons of yard trimmings

annually and will reduce hauling and disposal costs, greenhouse gas emissions, extend the life of the landfill, and provide high-quality compost and landscaping materials for residents. Environmental services have received 1,872 roll carts and has begun to assemble these roll carts. We will begin to distribute the roll carts to residents in the coming months.

Landfill Cap Erosion Control





Maintenance of the closed landfill is an ongoing process for Environmental Services. Most recently in efforts to keep the erosion at a minimum Environmental Services staff has begun to construct measures to slow the flow of water on the south slope of the landfill cap.







Month by Month Recycling Comparison




Benefits of Recycling

In response to a rash of break-ins at the Pajarito Cliffs Site (PCS) in recent months, Los Alamos County Staff assigned to work at that site gathered with Chief Sgambellone, and other representatives of the Police Department, to discuss and select security enhancements designed to "harden the target" and deter further burglaries and property loss. 
