

### ALIGNMENT 1



>85' skewed underpass **≻Vertical grades** up to 5% Less impacts to utilities ➤ Cast-in-place wing walls and headwalls





### ALIGNMENT 2

≻60' parallel underpass >Vertical grades up to 5% > Difficult to construct ➢ Retaining wall up to 12 feet in height





### **ALTERNATIVE 1**

 Precast Concrete Box Culvert (CBC)
 14-ft or 12-ft span by 10-ft height




