Why would you like to serve on this particular Board?
I am deeply passionate about sustainability and the pursuit of a more environmentally, socially, and economically sustainable community. There have been a number of projects the County has undertaken (i.e. Increased recycling, installation of a solar array, electric vehicle charging stations, LEED Green Buildings, etc) to make our community more sustainable and I would like to aid in that progression. I believe that my experience as a community member, an Environmental Professional, and my University background in Energy and Sustainability can help support Los Alamos County's continuing goal of becoming more sustainable.
2. What volunteer or professional activities have you participated in that could apply to this appointment?
I work under the Associate Directorate of Environmental Management at Los Alamos National Laboratory as an Environmental Professional, I specifically work for the Individual Permit Stormwater group that manages Site Monitoring Areas on both laboratory and Los Alamos County Land. Our group develops sustainable stormwater controls that provide on-site capture of stormwater-conveyed constituents. I have a Master of Applied Science in Environmental Policy and Management with an emphasis in Energy and Sustainability and am also a Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Green Associate.
3. The time involved may be 10-15 hrs per month or more. Are you able to serve the volunteer hours and attend training needed to perform your duties as an appointee?
I would be happy to volunteer my time to support the Environmental Sustainability Board.
4. What would you like to accomplish during your tenure on this Board or Commission? (Please identify any special interests you have that led you to become interested in serving on this Board or Commission.)
There are a bevy of Interests I would like to see the county undertake such as green infrastructure stormwater controls that help capture contaminants from urban areas and the roads, as well provide the benefit of groundwater recharge through developing controls that mimic predevelopment conditions. I would also like to see further promotion of Los Alamos as a more walkable community with an enhanced public transit system. I would also like to help develop programs that promote increased community recycling of various wastes (through education, smaller trash bins, larger recycling bins, etc) to help reduce waste sent off the Hill. Overall, I would like to continue to find ways to make Los Alamos County more environmentally, socially, and economically sustainable, and perhaps even pioneer several new efforts in sustainability.

Beyond attending several Sustainability Board meetings, reading through various sustainability plans, and occasionally interfacing with Danny Katzman who is on the Board, I have not had much interaction with the Board.
