Administration Division

2017 Bond Project Update

Dekker Perich Sabatini are developing project displays to promote a ballot question in the amount of \$20 million for a May 2017 all mail ballot. The list includes Golf Course Improvements, Softball Field improvements at Overlook Park, a new Recreation Center with Ice Rink, a new Multi-generational pool and a Splash Pad at Pinon Park in White Rock. Council also voted to direct staff to develop a plan for advertising and promoting the bond.

Transportation Board

The Transportation Board meets the first Thursday of the month at 5:30 p.m. Meetings are held at 1000 Central Avenue, Room #110. The Transportation Board is working to fill one vacancy.

Airport Division

Fence Project

The Airport Manager has been informed that the FAA will fund the design of this project this fiscal year



and the construction of the project in FY 2018. Grant applications have been sent to the FAA and the NMDOT-Aviation Division for the design phase of the project. The grant from the NMDOT-Aviation Division is awaiting signature by the State. The FAA grant is being held by the FAA until their funding for the remainder of this fiscal year has been approved. The FAA will fund 90% of the project and the State will fund 5% of the project.

Hangar Construction



We are in the process of finalizing the contract for the purchase of the prefabricated hangars from Erect-A-Tube. Once the contract has been finalized we should receive the sealed plans from Erect-A-Tube within three weeks. At that point we can begin getting quotes for the construction of the hangars. It will take Erect-A-Tube approximately four

months to fabricate and deliver the hangar materials on site, then begin the assembly of the hangars. The four hangars consist of one 60 foot by 60 foot box hangar and three T-hangars. These hangars will be available for lease and will be the first hangars owned by the County at the airport.

Aviation-Aerospace Day at the Legislature

Custodial Division

The Custodial Division supported 171 events during the month of January.

The RFP for custodial services at the Pajarito Cliffs Site closed on December 2 and is in the process of being scored.

The White Rock Activity Center and Town Hall had furniture installed and will be open for reservations starting on February 1.

An ATV with a plow was purchased for use at the Municipal and surrounding facilities for more efficient snow removal.

Windows were cleaned at the White Rock Library and Nature Center.

Engineering & Project Management Division

Fire Station 3

Architectural design work is nearing completion and includes a more substantial reroofing, as well as a new wall system, window replacement and HVAC system modifications to better insulate and control the temperature in the bunkrooms.

Fuller Lodge Phases 2-4 and Historical Museum

A Grand Re-opening ceremony is scheduled for January 31, 2017 at 2:00 pm.

R&M Construction is essentially complete with both facilities with only three punch list items remaining, that are exterior elements to be completed in the spring as weather permits.

Mesa Library HVAC Improvements

The current system is an evaporative cool system, while a less expensive system to install and operate however, it does not provide adequate cooling during times of high (30% plus) humidity. The system itself is limited in its cooling capacity due to its original design. The design consultant evaluated several system options which included an initial and life-cycle cost analysis. This evaluation resulted in a system selection to proceed to the design phase.

The 65% design development drawings have been received and are under review. It is anticipated that this project will be advertised for bid in February, with construction work scheduled to occur in August 2017. Staff is evaluating options to reduce impacts and disruption of services.



White Rock Complex & Senior Center Renovations

Senior Center



Activity Center

The Senior Center, Activity Hall and Town Hall are all complete, with only minor punch list items left. The kitchen is operational and opened for meal service January 9th, 2017.

A ribbon cutting ceremony will be held in February 2017.

Youth Activity Center Remodel

Interior improvements are underway for the Youth Activity Center, located in the basement of the Community Building. The construction contract was awarded to AIC General Contractors at the December 20th Council Meeting. Work includes replacing the sloped concrete floors, finishing the entire floor as polished concrete, abatement, replacing cabinetry, and upgrading a fire exit door to be compliant with current codes. These improvements are expected to continue through the end of March.

The Youth Activity Center operation was relocated to a space leased by the County at 1911 Central Ave., upstairs from the Endoscopy Center. The Center was open again for the children as planned on January 9th along with the restart of the school.







Canyon Rim Trail Project Phase II

This project has been completed successfully on schedule and within budget.

Cumbres Del Sol Subdivision Roadway Improvements Project

Project design is currently underway. This project is scheduled to be presented to the Transportation Board and the public meeting on February 2, 2017 at 5:30 pm in Council Chambers. Construction is scheduled to begin on May 1, 2017 with final and anticipated completion of August 15, 2017. The Project consist of roadway improvements, which includes asphalt paving, curb, gutter, sidewalks, ADA curb ramps, drive pads and drainage structures.

20th Street Extension Project

Project design is currently underway. This project is scheduled to be presented to the Transportation Board meeting on March 2, 2017 at 5:30 pm. Construction is scheduled to begin in June with an anticipated completion of September 2017. The project will consist of roadway and utility improvements, which includes asphalt paving, curb, gutter, sidewalks, ADA curb ramps, drive pads and drainage structures. Survey and Economic Development staff are also working together to develop a plat to guide future development of the site in conjunction with the street improvements.

Upcoming Projects...

- Canyon Rim Trail Phase III Improvements The Project consists of easement acquisition and preliminary design to continue the multi-use trail from Knecht Street to 20th Street.
- The County is awaiting the results of a \$2M grant request submitted to the Regional Transportation Planning Organization for a trail underpass under NM 502 near the Co-op and Entrada Drive.
- NM 4/East Jemez Rd. (Truck Route) Intersection: Staff continues to work with DOE, NMDOT, and Army Corps of Engineers to program, design and construct intersection upgrades to improve capacity and safety.
- NM 502 Reconstruction, Knecht St. to Tewa Loop: Staff continues to coordinate with NMDOT on this state lead project scheduled to begin this summer.

Environmental Division

Los Alamos County Landfill Gas Update

This is a summary of the results of the December 2016 Gas Probes and Landfill Gas (LFG) Vents for the extraction system located at the Los Alamos County Landfill.

- 1. For the LFG Vents, methane concentrations ranged from 29.1 (LFG-7) to 56.3 (LFG-1) percent volume in air. The majority of the vents contained the same concentration of methane compared to last month's readings. Of the remainder of the vents, two vents decreased and one vent increased in methane concentrations.
- 2. For the Gas Probes located at the toe of the landfill waste materials, methane concentrations ranged from 3.3 (MP-12) to 41.5 (MP-8) percent volume in air. All these gas probes either decreased in methane concentrations or remained the same.
- 3. For the Gas Probes located along the boundary of the landfill property: methane concentrations ranged from 0.1 (MP-8R) to 16 (MP-11) percent volume in air.
- 4. Methane concentrations at the blower remain relatively stable.



On December 29, 2016, three bear resistant dumpsters were delivered to Los Alamos Medical Center. These dumpsters are a safety measure in effort to deter bears from feeding at these dumpsters and to minimize human-bear interactions. This project was funded collaboratively by NM Game and Fish, Los Alamos County Environmental Services and Los Alamos Medical Center. A special thank you should be extended to Bob Osborn, Assistant Chief of Private Land Programs at Game and Fish, for all his time and effort.

Traffic & Streets Division

The Traffic and Streets Administration Division processed 336 permits, including traffic control, excavation and curb cut permits for the year 2016. It was a very busy year for construction, movie filming projects, and special events.

There has been significant snow fall in the County in December and January. Crews have been working late/early hours and weekends to remove snow so residents can travel to and from work, school, the airport and the ski hill.
