# Parks & Recreation Board Response to County Council Direction of August 29, 2017

- Evaluate Issues and Formulate Recommendations
  - Softball and baseball capacity needs
  - Facility uses
  - Lighting

### Information Gathering Process

- Review Current Ballfields
  - Onsite workshops
  - Physical condition, benefits to the community
- Discussion Points
  - Usage
    - Field user meetings
    - April 1 Oct. 31<sup>st</sup> scheduled use
    - Feb March: Increased scheduled use



### Results and Recommendations

- Capacity gaps
  - Capacity needs met presently
  - Growth through collaborative scheduling
- Improve land use to accommodate all alternate user groups/types
- Recognize alternate user groups: drop-in community uses, pocket park/natural area, trails, trailheads, playgrounds, special events
- Ballfields are an integral part of park, meet changing needs of all users
- Incorporate surrounding neighborhoods with park based decisions



## Results and Recommendations (cont'd)

- Strategies to Maximize Multiple Uses
  - Moveable outfield fencing
  - Portable pitching mounds
  - Scheduling to match actual usage
  - Ultimate Frisbee, picnics, hacky sack, pickup games, kickball and volleyball, informal practice for baseball, softball & special events
  - Field rotation options for turf regeneration



### **PRB Recommendation**

#### The Motion: Unanimous Vote

"That Los Alamos County promote maximum utilization of the ballfield facilities for current and future needs, while making the most of the present facilities, through multiple use and the recommendations as described. Further that sports complex maintenance and the prioritization of improvements be added to the FY19 Work Plan, so that the maintenance condition of the fields be optimized and so that timely continued partnership efforts coincide with future funding in addition to ensuring the varsity softball field solutions continue be kept in mind".



# Parks and Recreation Board Work Plan and Next Steps

- Based on Ballfield Assessment recommendations, provide continued public updates on progress and next steps for Overlook Park and North Mesa Sports Complex.
- Meet in the field with and invite more groups and individuals to the Parks and Recreation Board meetings to outline their programs, interests, current challenges and suggested solutions to strengthen the Board's connections with the community that uses the parks, recreation programs and facilities.

### Facility Uses and Safety Concerns

In meeting with the user groups we identified desired facility use improvements and safety concerns. Some of the improvements are currently being addressed. Others are being planned for upcoming years.

#### Some examples:

- New irrigation systems
- Spectator shading
- Backstop improvements
- Fencing improvements

- Turf improvements
- Portable fencing
- Safety netting
- Educating groups on field wear patterns



## Stadium Lighting

Lighting is not currently needed. If the user groups grow or we desire to host large tournaments, lighting will be needed to accommodate these groups.
