1/18 This bill was ruled germane by the Senate Committee's Committee. We are on our way.

1/26 Our bill was heard in Sen. Corporations. No opposition. Very few questions from the Committee. There was one regarding the constitutionality of the bill and the Chairman asked if we were changing the rules on bidders in the middle of the game. Fairly quick hearing...the Chairman wanted to move the agenda along.

1/27

I had a meeting with Senator Wirth yesterday afternoon on a different matter. As we were wrapping up the conversation, I told him I had just come from the Senate Corporations Committee meeting and the lab tax bill had passed out. He was very pleased to hear that. He told me how important the bill is and even told me that he brought the bill up to the Governor during a leadership meeting with her the day before.

He did say however, that the bill still could be changed in Senate Finance to add the 25 million dollar cap with an exclusion of Medical Services per Harper talk. When I mentioned the fact that Harper was opposed to having the words "National Laboratory" in the bill, how could he want the words "Medical Services." Apparently he is willing to settle with that language. If that's the case expect an amendment by Senator Cisneros. It all should be okay though. We had talked with the Senator and

Well...I just spoke with Carlos. He is very happy.

He doesn't want to amend the bill in SFC. He wants to ride it out, get it through the Senate and deal with things as they come up in the House.

He also thinks it might hit SFC as soon as Wed. Stay tuned....

- 1/31 In Senate Finance on 2/1
- 2/1 The issue of a Congressional staffer phone call came up. The Committee was not moved and the bill passed with little discussion. Onto the Senate floor.
- 2/3 We passed off the Senate floor with a nice margin. The PIT issue came up again...we need to get the Congressional letter to put the matter to rest. I have asked the Speaker to give us one referral in the House.
- 2/10 We should be in House Tax Committee on Monday. NO amendments.
- 2/12 We attempted an amendment but the Speaker pretty well killed the idea. We got out of the committee with a good, bipartisan vote. Good hearing.
- 2/13 Bam! Passed the House with a nice margin and very little debate.
- 3/7 Our bill was vetoed by the Governor. Here is the veto message:

SENATE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 92

The Honorable Mary Kay Papen, President Pro Tempore and Members of the New Mexico State Senate State Capitol Building Santa Fe, New Mexico 87501

Honorable President Pro Tempore Papen and Members of the Senate:

Pursuant to the Constitution of the State of New Mexico, Article IV, Section 22, I hereby VETO and return SENATE BILL 17, enacted by the Fifty-Third Legislature, Second Session, 2018.

This bill would require that a designated nonprofit organization (nonprofit) that is the prime contractor operating a facility in New Mexico that is designated as a national laboratory to pay gross receipts tax (GRT). As written, this bill is problematic for several reasons.

This bill is designed to require one specific nonprofit to pay gross receipts tax when others are not required to do so—the nonprofit that will take over the contract to operate Los Alamos National Laboratory (LANL) when the current contract ends later this year. This is poorly-crafted tax policy. A proposed amendment would have remedied this issue—requiring all nonprofits with revenues over a certain threshold to pay GRT. This would have been a step in the right direction to ensure fair and equitable tax policy in New Mexico. Instead, the sponsor chose to withdraw the amendment, leaving the original bill language intact.

Nonprofit organizations currently do not pay GRT; therefore, a nonprofit taking over the LANL contract will result in a loss of GRT revenue. While this is of concern, the revenue loss will be less than what it is claimed to be; if the prime contractor is a nonprofit, then the subcontractors become taxable. Therefore, the total revenue loss becomes less than the current GRT paid by a for-profit entity.

Additionally, this bill is yet another piecemeal attempt at tax reform. I have repeatedly said that I will not sign tax increase bills outside of comprehensive tax reform. This concept should have been included in a larger tax reform package; yet again, the Legislature refused to pass comprehensive tax reform and continues to send bills like these to my desk.
