Additional Information on Richard Swenson's Work

- During the last 10 years, Richard Swenson's metal sculptures have been sold and shipped throughout the U.S. by the New Concept Gallery on Canyon Road in Santa Fe.
- Over 30 pieces of his sculptures were on display for a 3-month period at the Louisiana
 Art & Science Museum in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. It was in conjunction with the show of
 the Smithsonian collection of Jim Henson puppets.
- At the request of the LA County Mesa Public Library, Richard has displayed his sculptures at the library at 2 separate occasions (2011 and 2017), both a-month long show.
- During April 26 May 27, 2019, the New Concept Gallery (610 Canyon Road, Santa Fe, NM 87501) will host a solo show of Richard Swenson's sculptures, as part of 15 galleries that participated in the Canyon Road Sculpture Month. Opening Reception is May 3 (Friday), from 5:00 to 7:00 pm; all are invited.

Note: For many of the sculptures/figures that Richard Swenson have made, he does not consider or intend them to be art, but whimsical figures. His hope is that they will bring joy to the viewers.

The Lizard, being considered for the PEEC of the Los Alamos Nature Center, is designed to influence children's attention to nature, not art.


