Shirley Carter of Summit Garden Club and a Landscape Architect did the major work and collection of dried horticulture on the wreath, as it has been stored and designed in her garage. The three pine needle baskets on the wreath were handmade by Shirley and each basket contains Pajarito Plateau dried horticulture. Doris Jackson of Los Alamos Garden Club and an NGC Master Flower Show Judge helped with advice, design and donated some of the horticulture that was used in the wreath. Summit Garden Club and Los Alamos Garden Club members also contributed dried horticulture for the 4 foot wide wreath. The two Clubs are in Los Alamos and are members of the National Garden Clubs, Inc., New Mexico Garden Clubs and District II.
