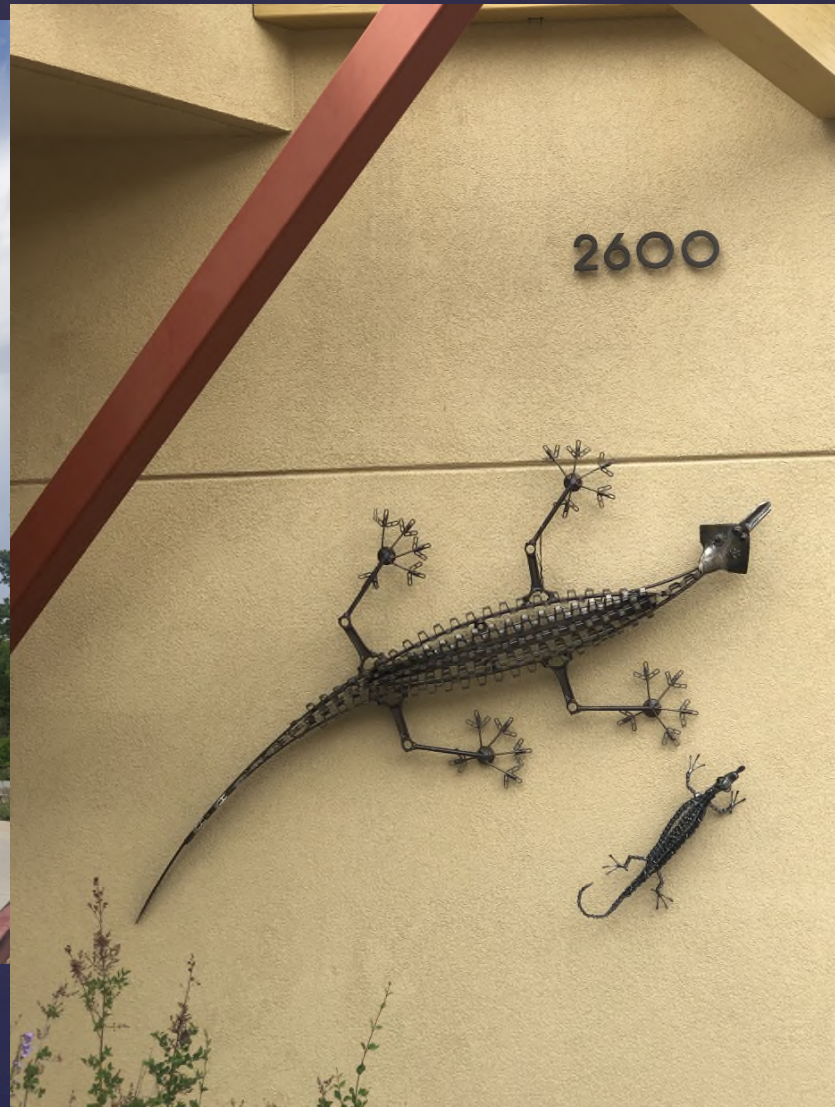

- ✧ Maintain current artworks and document the collection
- ✧ Create appropriate matches between location and artwork, considering factors such as size, style, and function, among others.
- ✧ Diversify the County's art collection with new acquisitions
- ✧ Diversify the locations of public art within the County (especially in White Rock) with new acquisitions and relocation of existing art

Challenges and Lessons Learned

Collection Management continues to be an issue as our public art collection has grown to over 200 pieces. Recognizing the need for a better database for organizing information, photos, contracts, etc., an RFP was issued for a Collection Management System provider. Bids are under review.

Collaborations and Working Relationships

APPB works closely with Parks, Public Works, and Facilities regarding placement, installation, lighting, and landscaping.

Sculpture Smart, a Santa Fe based company, is contracted with the county to clean and maintain outdoor sculptures.

The Board collaborates as needed with other Boards, Commissions, and departments.
