# Ed Grothus "Sunflower" donation

- ⌘ Due to Covid, the skilled craftspeople needed for restoration and reinforcement may be hard to come by, so we don't have an estimated completion date, but the County would need to take possession of the artwork ASAP.
- ⌘ At \$60,000, this may be our most expensive donation to date, but in the words of one of the extant public comments: "This is part of Los Alamos history! And it's bright and beautiful. Please restore it and install it prominently where we can all enjoy it and think about its meaning(s)."



# 2020 APPB Proposals

APPB recommends the following expenditures to come from the dedicated Art in Public Places fund:

- ⌘ Carrie Quade splash pad mural                      \$67,000
- ⌘ Jeff Segler “Boys of Pajarito Plateau” \$70,000
- ⌘ Ed Grothus “Sunflower”:  
   \$60,000  
   \$197,000

Current balance ~\$602,900 (FY21 Expenditure Budget)

~\$15,000 / year for maintenance
