Chair Chandler reported that he spent time in New York and Houston. He mentioned that the state of sustainability and ESG has changed and is constantly evolving. There is no standardization of metrics or adopted practices between companies. He would like for the ESB members to be open minded and for more community participation.

4). County Council Liaison - Randall Ryti

Councilor Ryti mentioned that he looked forward to working with ESB.

- Mentioned some ideas on how to get people more interested in attending or watching meetings.
- Councilor Ryti is also the liaison to the Parks and Recreation Board and mentioned that at their last meeting they talked about areas that are parks; however, are not actively being used and on wildlife, and some areas that need restoration.
- Reported that he had traveled to Washington, DC attending Federal Work Group advocacy meetings talking

to our delegation and Department of Energy also attended the NACO Legislative Conference he is on their Environmental and Land Use Steering Sub-Committee many interesting items, also had a discussion on grants, there is all kinds of opportunities for cities or counties to get funding for initiatives for the Climate Action Plan.

- Mentioned that in working on the survey questions he would be happy to sit in meetings.
- The council meeting on Tuesday, February 20th is a working session. They will be having a discussion on quality-of-life goals, an update from Transportation Board Chair, and presentation on downtown Los Alamos.
- At the February 27th Council Regular Session important meeting, discussion on the 2023 salary survey, there will be an implementation plan proposed, talking about regional planning, and presentation on the Foxtail project.
- Mentioned that it will be County Manager's Steven Lynne's last meeting, Council will be recognizing him at that meeting.

C. Team Reports

1). Bee City Team/Seed Library - KokHeong McNaughton

Member McNaughton reported that the Bee City team is keeping a tab of organizations and individuals who have indicated they are interested in creating pollinator gardens. Last month there were three organizations and another organization that is now interested is the YMCA Teen Center. She is also keeping a running tab of the number of square footage in Los Alamos County that has been converted into pollinator habitats since 2023. The Bee City application status has been sent in and is being reviewed, should be complete in a few weeks.

Under Community Seed Library report the community seed swap on February 3rd was well attended. It was a lively gathering with people excited about growing food, creating pollinator habitats, and general gardening tips.

Next program will be on Saturday, February 17th, called Garden Planning Design Panel, from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Mesa Public Library. Next event with be Saturday, March 2nd to celebrate the first anniversary of operation by having a birthday party.

2). Los Alamos Sustainability Alliance - Angelica Gurule/Kokheong McNaughton

Member McNaughton reported the sustainability meeting has changed the monthly meeting to the 2nd Thursday of the month from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in conference room 200 of the Municipal Building. At the last meeting discussed videotaping individuals and their efforts in the community as to how they are actively helping to save energy. They identified four individuals with topics such as solar panels, electric vehicles, collecting rain and so on. They will be working with PAC 8 for the videos.

Deputy County Manager Linda Matteson reported for Sustainability Manager Angelica Gurule that at the last Council meeting Public Works gave an update on the implementation food waste composting at the Eco Station and using the Aerated Static Piles method was approved by Council and a letter has been signed by the County Manager and has gone to the Department of Energy. Cascadia will be presenting to Council on March 5th on Greenhouse Gas Inventory and will lay out their public engagement plan and steps to accomplish to get us to the final CAP.
