[19782-25](#) NM4 Crossing and Multi-Use Trail Improvements

Title: NM4 Crossing and Multi-Use Trail Improvements

Presented by: Keith Wilson

- Project Overview:
 - Re-evaluation of HAWK Crossing location

- Conflicts at the NM4/La Vista intersection
- Re-evaluation of NM4 Westbound Lane reduction
- Re-Evaluation of NM4 Northside Trail location
- Pinon Elementary School Trail update
- Project timeframe updates:
 - Upcoming public meeting scheduled for May or June 2025
 - Construction planned from Fall 2025 to Fall 2026
- Safety concerns:
 - One crash recorded from 2019-2023
 - Warrants for a new signal light were not met
 - Discussions on pedestrian and bicycle lane concerns
 - Proposed reduction in speed limits for eastbound traffic
- Additional considerations:
 - Concerns raised about the 7-second crossing time for the HAWK signal
 - Proposal for emergency staff input on safety measures
- Member Muck suggested using an overpass instead of the HAWK Signal.
- Member Talley mentioned that she appreciated staff reviewing and addressing all the concerns that were brought up at the last meeting. She really liked the video of the children trying to cross NM4. She asked for clarification regarding the conflict diagram and points and the mid-block crossing.
- Member Strickfaden agreed with everything that Member Talley said and she thinks it's a good plan.
- Member Lisowski mentioned that a lot of work has gone into the planning process since the last meeting. He asked to see the video that was presented earlier in the meeting since he was late.

Members of the public provided comments.

Member Strickfaden made a motion stating that the Transportation Board recommend the NM4 Crossing and Multi-Use Trail Improvements Project as presented to the Los Alamos County Council.

I further move that the Transportation Board recommend the County work with Los Alamos Public Schools on an auxiliary trail connection from Piñon Park to Grand Canyon Drive.

Member Hampton seconded the motion.

Member Talley asked to include a friendly amendment; I further move that the Transportation Board recommend that county staff continue to pursue the traffic signal at Sherwood and NM4.

Member Strickfaden and Chair Hampton agreed to the friendly amendment.

After a vote, the motion passed 5-1 with Member Muck in opposition.

Update of the Los Alamos County Pedestrian Master Plan

Title: Pedestrian Master Plan

Presented by: Justin Gibson

- Project Overview:
 - The Development of pedestrian infrastructure
 - Implementation of the National Initiative Safe Systems.
 - Vision focuses on creating a walkable community.
 - Goals center around public engagement.
 - Focus Areas: Los Alamos Townsite and White Rock Town Center, including key connectivity areas.
- Visions and Goals:
 - Safety - Implementation of the National Initiative Safe Systems.
 - Connectivity - Develop a seamless, accessible pedestrian network.
 - Health - Encourage walking.
 - Equity - Access to pedestrian infrastructure for all community members.
- Additional participants included:
 - Noah Berke (Wilson and Co.)
 - Angelica (Wilson and Co. via Zoom).
- Additional Considerations:
 - Member Muck raised concerns about landscaping obstructing drivers' views.
 - Emphasized the importance of visibility for safety.
 - Member Edwards expressed satisfaction with the updated Pedestrian Master Plan.
 - Member Edwards suggested conducting a walking audit to identify existing issues.
 - Raised concerns about the functionality of HAWK signals regarding ADA accessibility. Clarified that HAWK signals include audible feedback features for visually impaired pedestrians.
 - Member Talley supported incorporating landscaping while ensuring visibility for drivers and pedestrians
- Next Steps:
 - The Pedestrian Master Plan noted that pedestrian crashes located in the private parking lot may require removal.
 - The Pedestrian Master Plan is a living document and is

subject to ongoing updates and community input.

- Members will review additional aspects of the plan during future meetings.

Member Strickfaden made a motion to approve the Pedestrian Masterplan contingent on the creation of an appendix based on comments from tonight's meeting.

After further discussion Member Strickfaden withdrew the motion.

Chair Hampton made a motion to recommend adoption of the Pedestrian Master Plan as presented with the addition of an appendix with incorporated comments from Ms. Swanson and Ms. Pilch.

Seconded by Member Edwards.

After further discussion Chair Hampton withdrew the motion.

Member Muck made a motion to table the Pedestrian Master Plan and bring it back to the board in March.

Member Talley seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously.
