Santa Fe Community College	\$60,000	<p>Need: Students need paid real-world workforce experience and mentors.</p> <p>Solution: Structured curriculum that provides workforce development through training, education, and real-world paid internships.</p> <p>Outcomes: 25- 30 paid internships with tracking of the percentage offered paid positions after completion</p>
