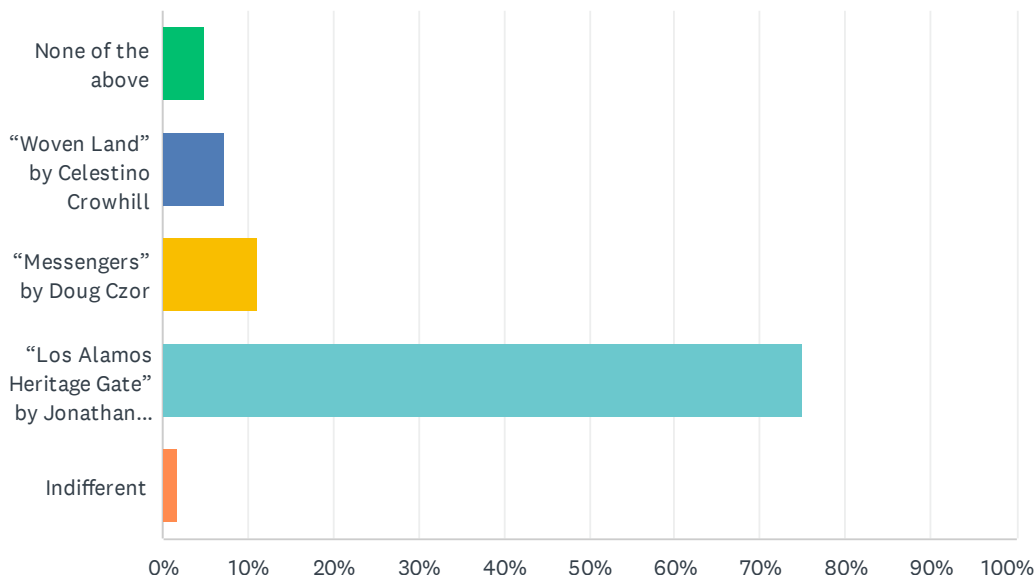


Q1 Which gate is your favorite? Please note these are renderings or examples, and not the actual pieces.

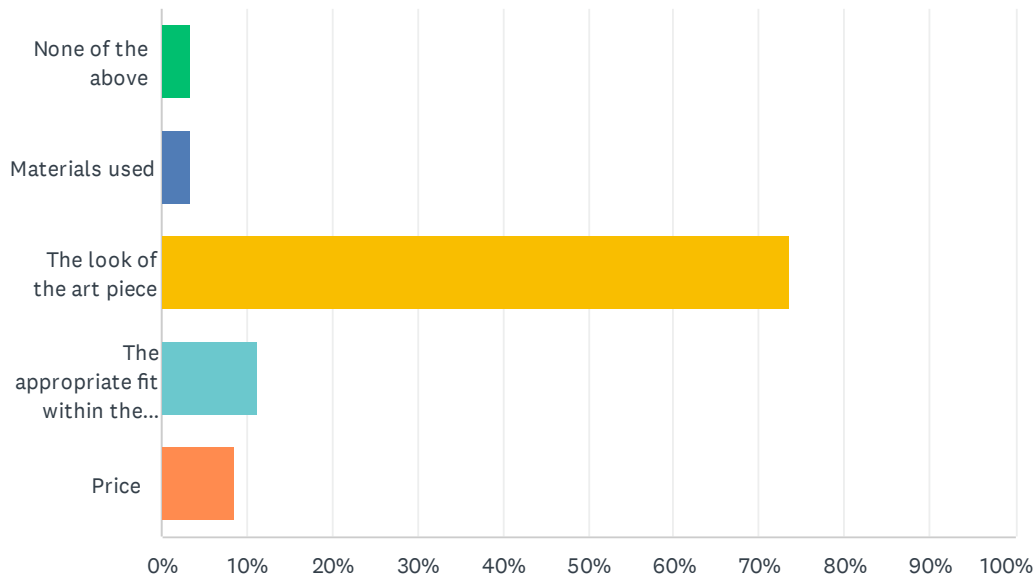

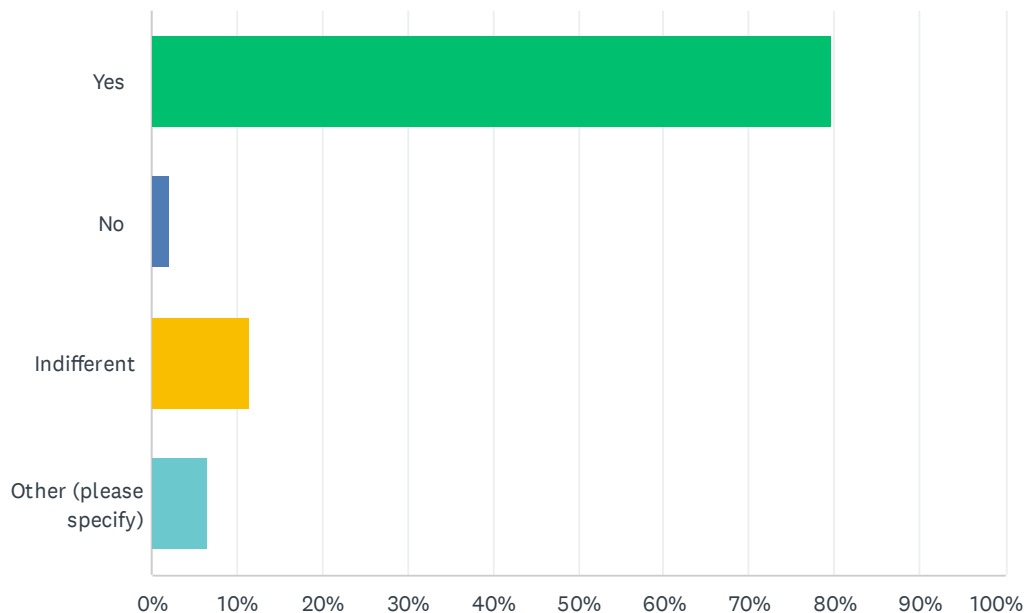
