He has experience working on large-scale construction projects, such as Tesla's battery plant in Reno and the Dolphins Stadium roof. Marlon is experienced in construction and maintenance of large facilities, which includes understanding zoning and regional building regulations. He's currently working remotely for JB Henderson.
