### Land Acknowledgement


Valles Caldera is of spiritual and ceremonial importance to numerous American Indian peoples in the greater Southwest region.

# What is a General Management Plan and Development Concept Plan?

A general management plan (GMP) is a broad document that defines long-term goals for the following over a 20-30 year horizon:

- Resource Protection
- Visitor Experience
- Facilities, Administration, and Operations
  - Focused Development Concepts for the Valle Grande District

### **Park Purpose & NPS Mission**

Located in the Jemez Mountains of north-central New Mexico, Valles Caldera National Preserve protects, preserves, and restores ecosystems and cultural landscapes within an outstanding example of a volcanic caldera for the purpose of education, scientific research, public enjoyment and use, and cultural continuity.

The National Park Service preserves unimpaired the natural and cultural resources and values of the national park system for the enjoyment, education, and inspiration of this and future generations. The Park Service cooperates with partners to extend the benefits of natural and cultural resource conservation and outdoor recreation throughout this country and the world.



- Required by the park's enabling legislation.
- Improve visitor experiences while preserving Valles Caldera's landscapes, resources, cultural connections, and habitats.
- Address visitor access to and within the park. Legacy roads were not engineered or designed for public use.
- Provide fundamental visitor services including potable water, restrooms, parking, and trails, that are accessible to all visitors including people with disabilities.
- Manage for current and future levels of visitation.


### **Existing Visitor Contact Buildings**





## Visitor Engagement Zone (Blue)


- Easy-to-reach areas where most short-term visitors to the park visit
- Most visitor services and park facilities
- Highest visitor density and most developed zone





## Self-Guided Zone (Orange)


- Public roads open seasonally
- Some visitor services and park facilities
- Some outdoor skill and preparation are needed
- Low to medium visitor density





## Backcountry Zone (Green)

- Primitive trails and minimal signage
- Low visitor density
- Least developed zone
- Natural processes, ecosystem function, and natural wildlife behavior are prioritized


