Cover Letter

Dear Selection Committee,

As an internationally recognized artist specializing in site-specific sculpture and installation, I am drawn to the opportunity to create a work that will serve as a strong visual focal point for the Los Alamos Police Memorial Wall site. My practice centers on creating large scale artworks that foster connection, harmony with nature, and a sense of hope, an approach I believe is essential for a location that welcomes both residents and visitors.

My work begins with deep research into the physical and social context of each site. Using metaphor and form, I create sculptures and installations that ask: "What might this space have become if the people using it had their desires met?" The resulting works transform public spaces into aspirational images, offering alternative realities that highlight each site's potential.

In my ongoing series *Landscape Collection*, I explore the romanticized notion of landscapes by integrating natural forms with architectural elements. These works juxtapose organic imagery with the built environment, creating unique and sometimes uncanny scenery that invites viewers to reconsider their relationship with nature. For me, public art is an opportunity to weave the narratives of a site into physical form, offering moments of contemplation in the midst of daily life. A lion sculpture placed at the heart of this memorial site can similarly bridge symbolism, environment, and community presence, inspiring reflection while celebrating strength and resilience.

I have completed several public art projects including *Home: Chinatown* in Ottawa, *Dream House* in Cedar Falls, *Silver Lining* in Decatur, and *When A Cloud Met A Cloud* in Santa Clarita. These works reflect my commitment to engaging communities and creating durable, inspiring landmarks for public spaces. Through these experiences, I have developed the ability to work with diverse stakeholders, adapt to varied site conditions, and select materials that ensure longevity and minimal maintenance.

For the Los Alamos Lion Sculpture, I envision a piece that embodies resilience, dignity, and community pride. Crafted from durable materials such as bronze or stainless steel, it will be proportioned to fit harmoniously within the site's footprint while maintaining a strong presence from all angles. My goal is to create a lasting symbol that complements the solemnity of the memorial wall while inviting daily engagement and reflection.

Cloud House is a unique rain harvesting system that creatively reuses the rainwater it collects to provide a deeper look into the natural systems that give us the food we eat.

Sujin Lim's sculpture and installation "Silver Lining" series started in 2003 and has been exhibited several times in galleries and museums shows in Seoul, Korea, as well as outdoor venues in Public Space in the US, Germany, and Korea.

In 2016, Artist Matthew Mazzotta invited Sujin's Silver Lining work into his developing *Cloud House* project where she designed the cloud model for the large cloud that sits on top of the house. The model was fabricated at 1:15 scale by a 7 axis CNC router out of foam and an eco non-toxic outer coating.

The plaza acted like a junction point where two contrasting elements Nature and Built environment met each other. *Dream House* can be a backdrop for performances which happen in the plaza. The sculpture enhances the intimacy of the space and its ability to be welcoming and bring all sorts of people together in the common environment.

Home is a whimsical gateway to the neighborhood of Cambridge Street North that symbolically takes the iconic shape of a 'house' to represent the people who made this neighborhood their home. It emulates the shared values of families living together for those in the surrounding area. For those who are visiting Chinatown, it is an image of a welcoming, family-oriented community.



When A Cloud Met A Cloud

When A Cloud Met A Cloud is a whimsical landmark in Central Park, celebrating the site's history with the Castaic Lake Water Agency. The sculpture embodies the water cycle—evaporation, condensation, precipitation—making the invisible visible through art. It connects clouds, rain, and water at the site, emphasizing their interdependence.

Rain sustains life, supporting agriculture, industry, and hygiene. The sculpture honors this with vibrant colors where pipes meet the ground, symbolizing CLWA's role in water distribution. Metal pipes metaphorically represent how water reaches the community.

As visitors pass by, the sculpture grounds them while its cloud-like forms stretch toward the sky, trees, and landscape. It's a playful, photogenic landmark where kids can dance between raindrops and everyone can engage with the beauty of water's journey.



Silver Lining in Good Company

Silver Lining in Good Company is a sculpture installation of a cloud-shaped human and dog at the Rosewood Arts Center. The installation welcomes visitors arriving at the Rosewood Arts Center into a space full of calm and joy.

The sculpture represents the relationship between living beings and nature. The imagery of cloud-headed sculptures is inspired by the idea of sharing thoughts and dreams between people and nature. Silver Lining in Good Company offers a joyful, relaxing, and soothing experience to all who encounter it. Nature allows us to experience its wonders and has the power to calm our minds and souls. The sculpture brings a dreamlike moment to our everyday lives through art, highlighting that we are all connected to nature.

Silver Lining is an installation consisting of 4 human scale anthropomorphized 'Clouds' that look like they are running/flying around the space. The viewer must look up to see the sculptures up close as they move around the space.

Polar Ball is a childlike abstraction of warmth, caring, intimacy, and vulnerability that allows the viewer to touch and sit inside the sculpture. People can enjoy touching the ball and sitting inside as well.
