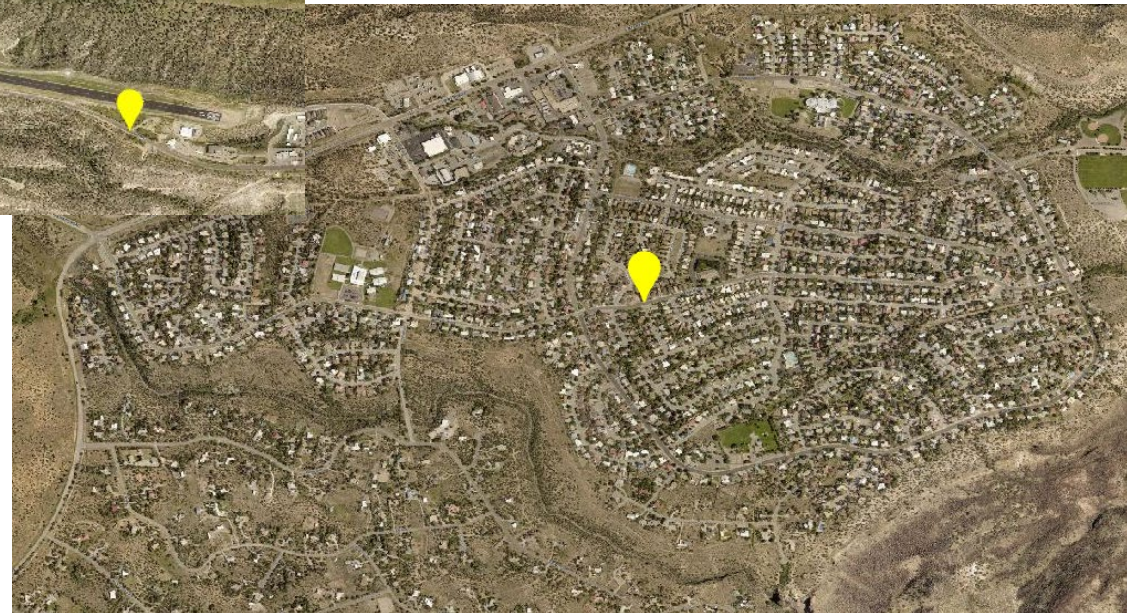

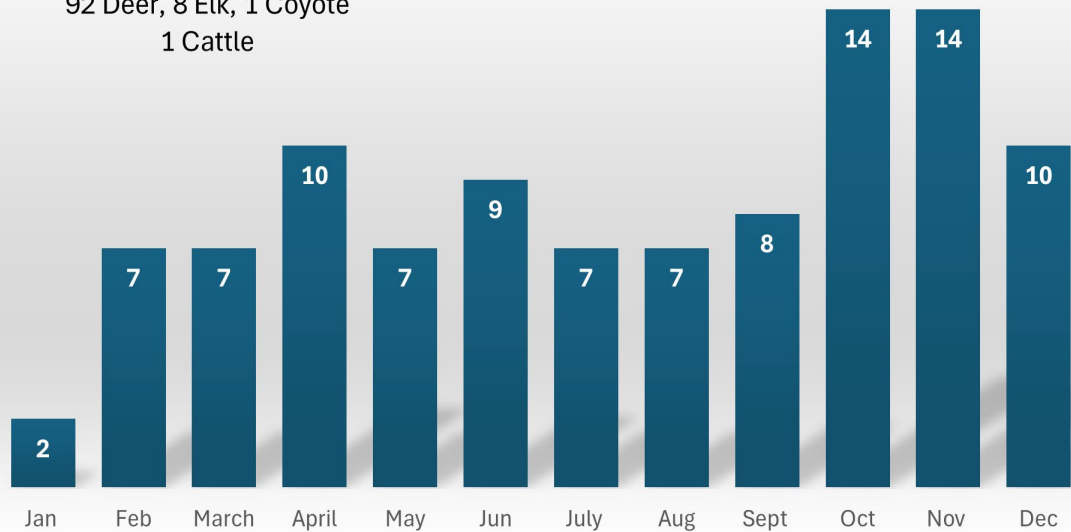

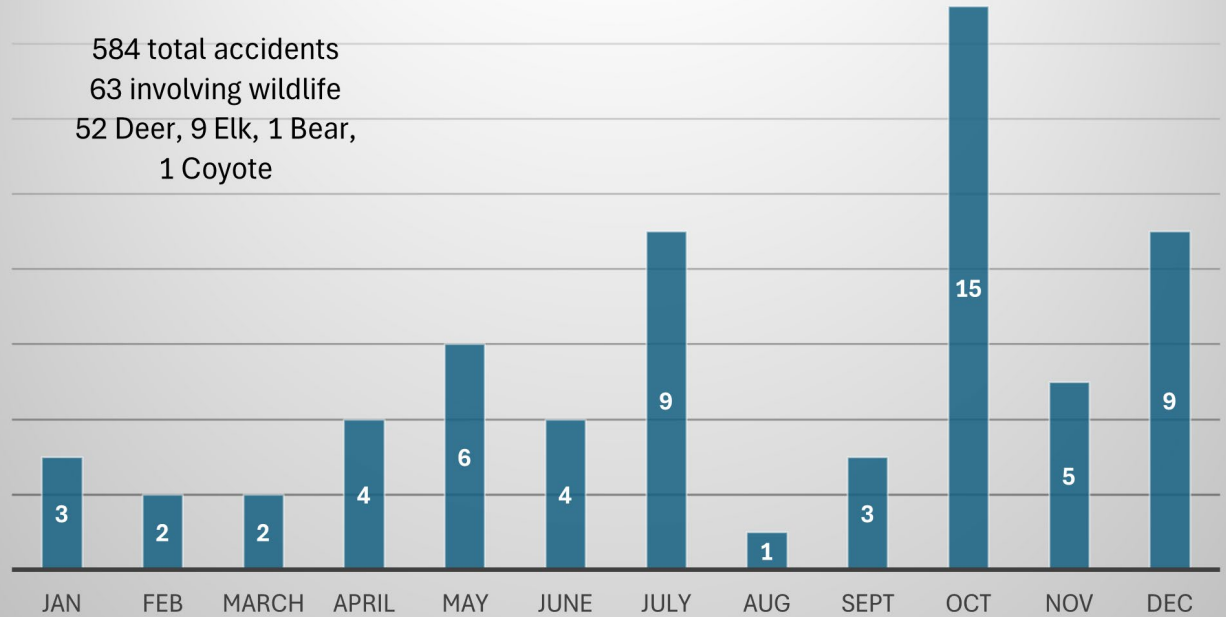

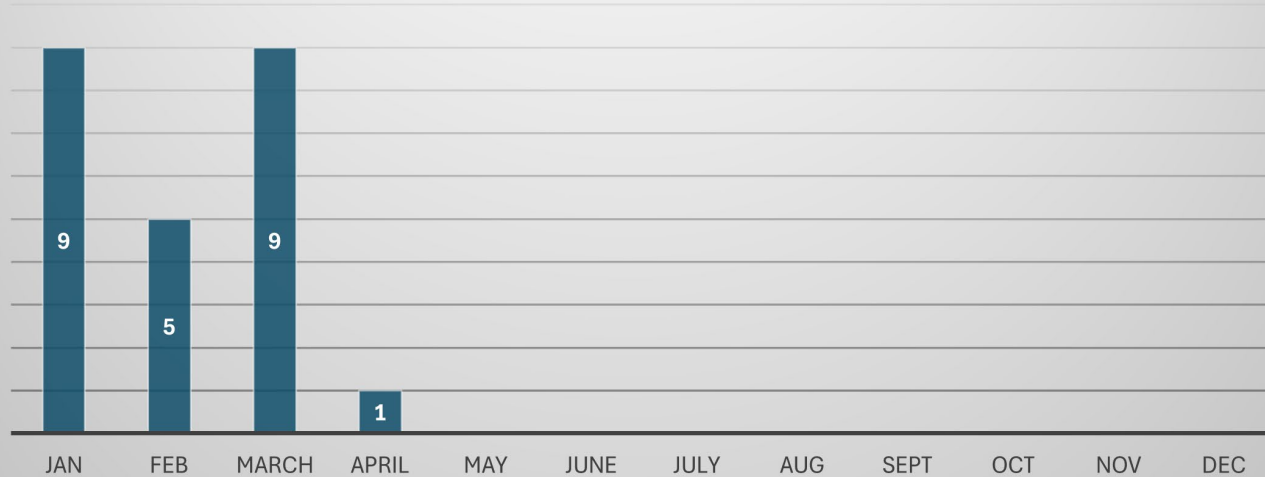

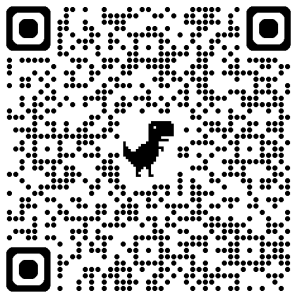


# Trinity Drive Safety and ADA Improvements Project

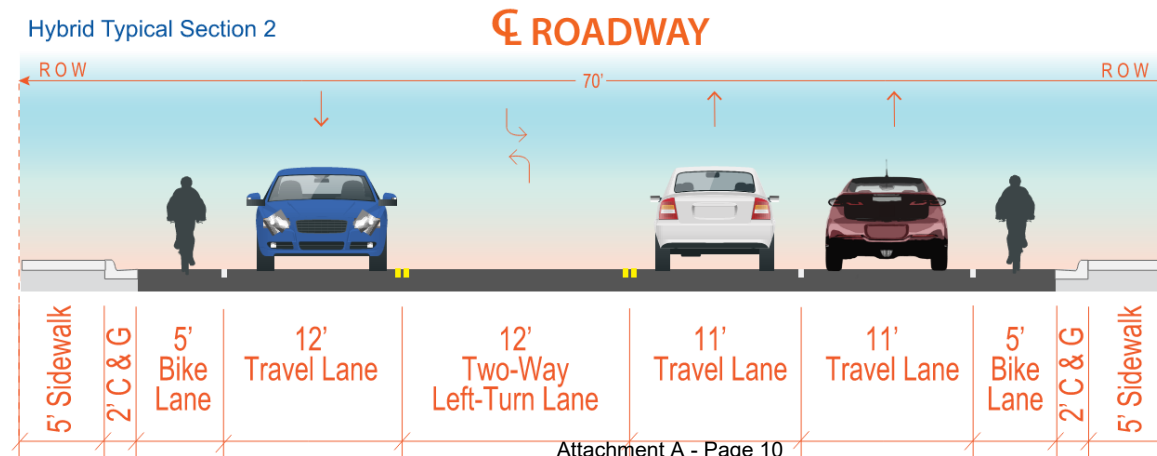

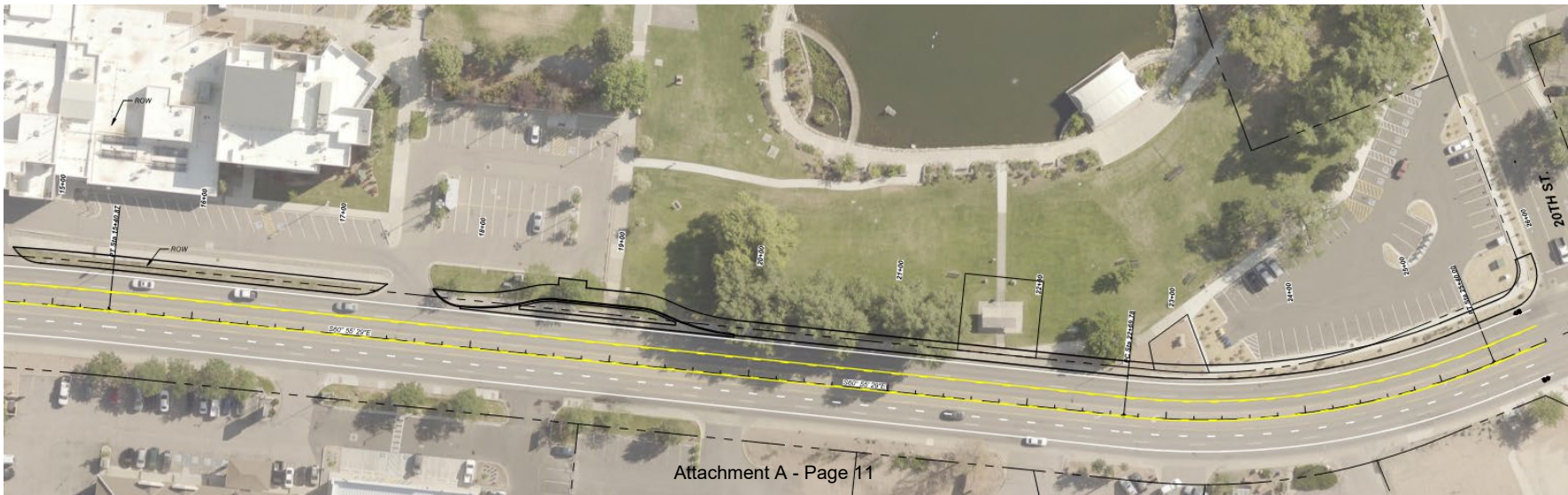

# Ashley Pond Crowd Protection Project

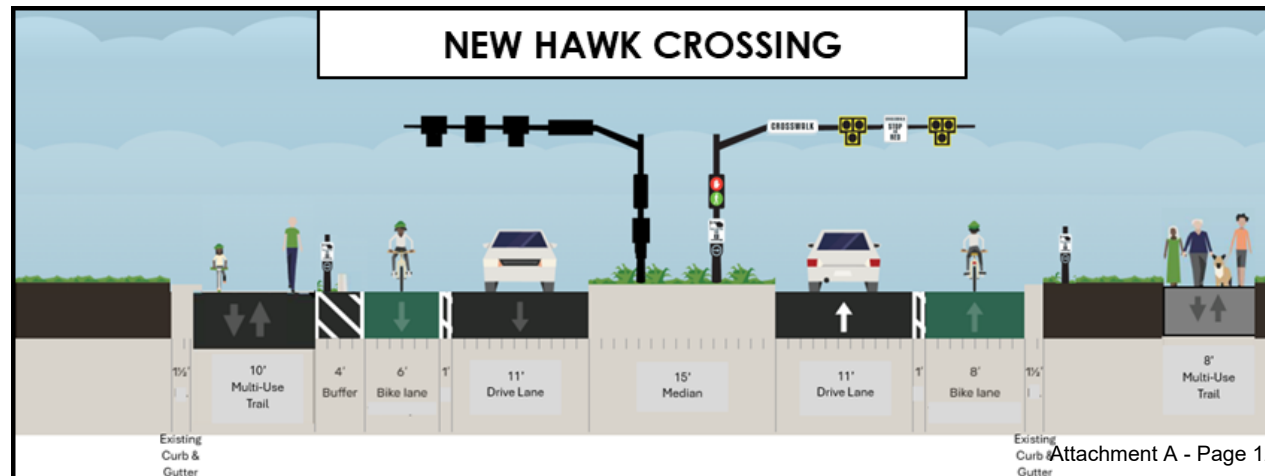
- Concrete Wall Barrier to be installed May 16 for 2026 Concert Season.
- Groundwork Studio contracted to develop permanent options. Up to 3 options being developed for consideration.
- Public Input opportunities on options will be provided.
- County and State Historic Offices approval will be needed for chosen option.
- Plan to have permanent solution in place by 2027 Concert Season



# NM4 Crossing & Multi-use Trail Improvement Project & Pinon School Trail

- Construction Schedule September 2026 – July 2027



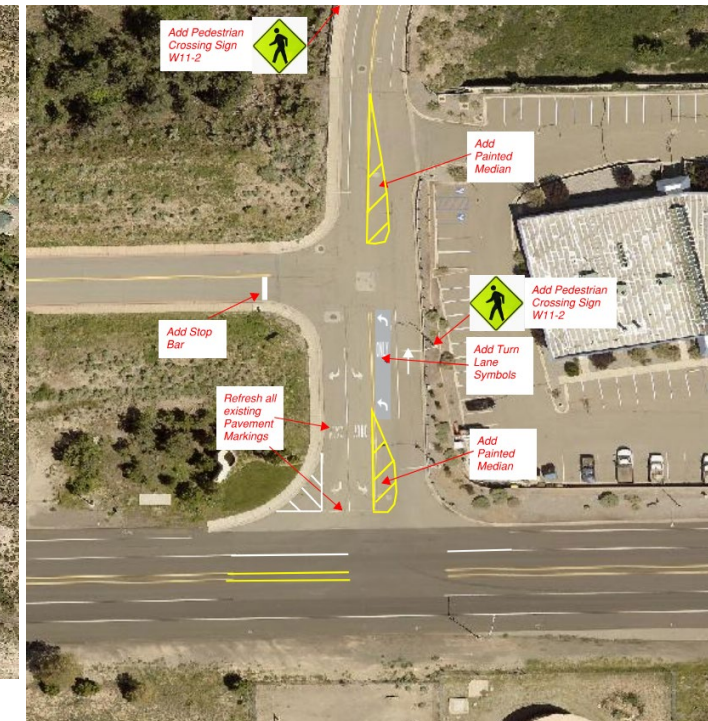
# Diamond Drive Wildlife Crash Study

- Wildlife Assessment for Los Alamos County – Kick-off May 2026. Expect recommendations for measures to mitigate animal/vehicle conflicts
- Investigating AI Animal Detection Systems to activate Warning Signage with pilot installation being developed.
- Investigated Streetlighting Options where none exist now. Cost concerns. Council Action needed.
- Evaluating Speeds



# NM 502 Crashes and Speeding

- Road Safety Audit with LANL/NMDOT completed October 2025 for area around Camino Entrada Intersection
  - Engineering Division exploring grant opportunities with NMDOT to fund study and preliminary design of RSA recommendations
- Camino Entrada Striping Plan implemented November 2025
- Centerline Rumble Strips installation scheduled for June 2026
- Speed data collection and analysis scheduled in May 2026



# Diamond Drive/Sycamore Pedestrian Crossing Study

- Previously Studied in 2023 and determined that additional measures were not justified
- Recent requests indicating that use and need for marked crosswalk has increased. New Study underway with recommendation expected by July 2026

# Central Ave Pedestrian Crossing Requests and Review

- Reviewed visibility of crosswalks along Central Avenue from 15<sup>th</sup> Street to Justice Center.
- Recommendations for ongoing parking removal to improve site distance at each crosswalk.
- Coordinating review of parking removal with LACDC and Businesses before implementation.
- Crosswalk Pavement Markings Installed at Central/Oppenheimer – September 2025
- Eastbound speed feedback sign relocated closer to crosswalk.
- Crosswalk Markings and Signage and possible RRFB at Rose Street under evaluation.
- Crosswalk pavement markings refresh - ongoing

# Canyon Rd Pedestrian Crossing Requests and Review

- Crosswalk Markings and Signage added to crossing at Aquatic Center – September 2025.
- Reviewing Citizen request/concerns for crossing near Canyon Village Apartments
- Reviewing Citizen request/concern for crossing near Myrtle Street Greenspace

# North Rd/Urban St Intersection Study

- March 15, 2026, Pedestrian Fatality Crash at intersection
- Citizen Petition submitted to consider making intersection 4-way stop
- April 7, 2026 Council Meeting, staff directed to investigate, research and return with a recommendation within 90-days
- Data Collection has been completed
- Data Analysis is underway
- Scheduled to Present Recommendations to Transportation Board on June 4, 2026
- Scheduled to Present Recommendations to Council on June 23, 2026





# 2026 Traffic Enforcement Update

- **Commuter Traffic Enforcement:**
  - Recent traffic monitoring conducted during morning and evening hours indicates a positive trend. Although vehicle speeds continue to exceed the limit by 16 to 25 mph, overall traffic behavior has shown some improvement, with a noticeable slowing trend.
- **Speeding and Dangerous Driving:**
  - Excessive speed and dangerous driving continue to be concerns, particularly among motorcycle operators. One individual was arrested for reckless driving, and another was cited for careless driving.
- **School Bus and School Zone Enforcement:**
  - School zone patrols resulted in multiple citations for failure to stop at stop signs and passing in designated no-passing zones.
- **DUI Enforcement:**
  - A DUI checkpoint occurred on April 30<sup>th</sup> from 1800 to 2300 hours, and DUI saturation patrols are ongoing
- **Interagency Coordination:**
  - The Traffic Unit is working to organize a multi-jurisdictional traffic enforcement operation targeting evening commuter traffic, in coordination with the New Mexico State Police, Pojoaque Tribal Police, and the Santa Fe County Sheriff's Office.
