2025 Work Plan: Overview

Comprehensive Plan Implementation

- August: Finalized entitlements for Fire Station 4 and approved 137 new dwelling units on North Mesa — directly supporting housing goals and critical infrastructure planning.
- September: Approved Los Alamos' first Cottage Development project, advancing diverse housing types and community amenities.

Development Code Updates

- September 10: Recommended Approval on the first package Chapter 16 revisions (Articles III and VI). Amendments aimed at improving clarity, consistency, and predictability.
- Additional commissioner trainings on land use, zoning process, and legal defensibility to strengthen and support sound decision-making.



2025 Work Plan: Overview

Commission Continuity and Training

September 9: Council appointed Robert Chrien to fill a vacant seat, maintaining a full commission and ensuring quorum.

Continued focus on commissioner on-boarding and training

Community Engagement & Coordination

- Information session with consultants to review the North Mesa traffic/road study
- Ongoing coordination with Council, County staff, and other boards to advance housing, mobility, and economic vitality goals.
- Comprehensive Plan Update working group (up to 3 PZC members)



Challenges to Priority Objectives:

Balancing Competing Priorities

 Housing, economic development, mobility, and neighborhood concerns sometimes conflict, requiring careful policy tradeoffs.

Complexity of Code Revisions

Revising Chapter 16 requires significant time, legal review, and public engagement

Term Limits, Onboarding, and Training

- Three experienced Commissioners will term-out in March 2026; will advertise vacancies early to allow for timely recruitment and continuity of quorum.
- Staff is currently developing a onboarding framework for new Commissioners, including discussions of roles and responsibilities, Chapter 16, Comprehensive Plan policies, and public hearing procedures.
