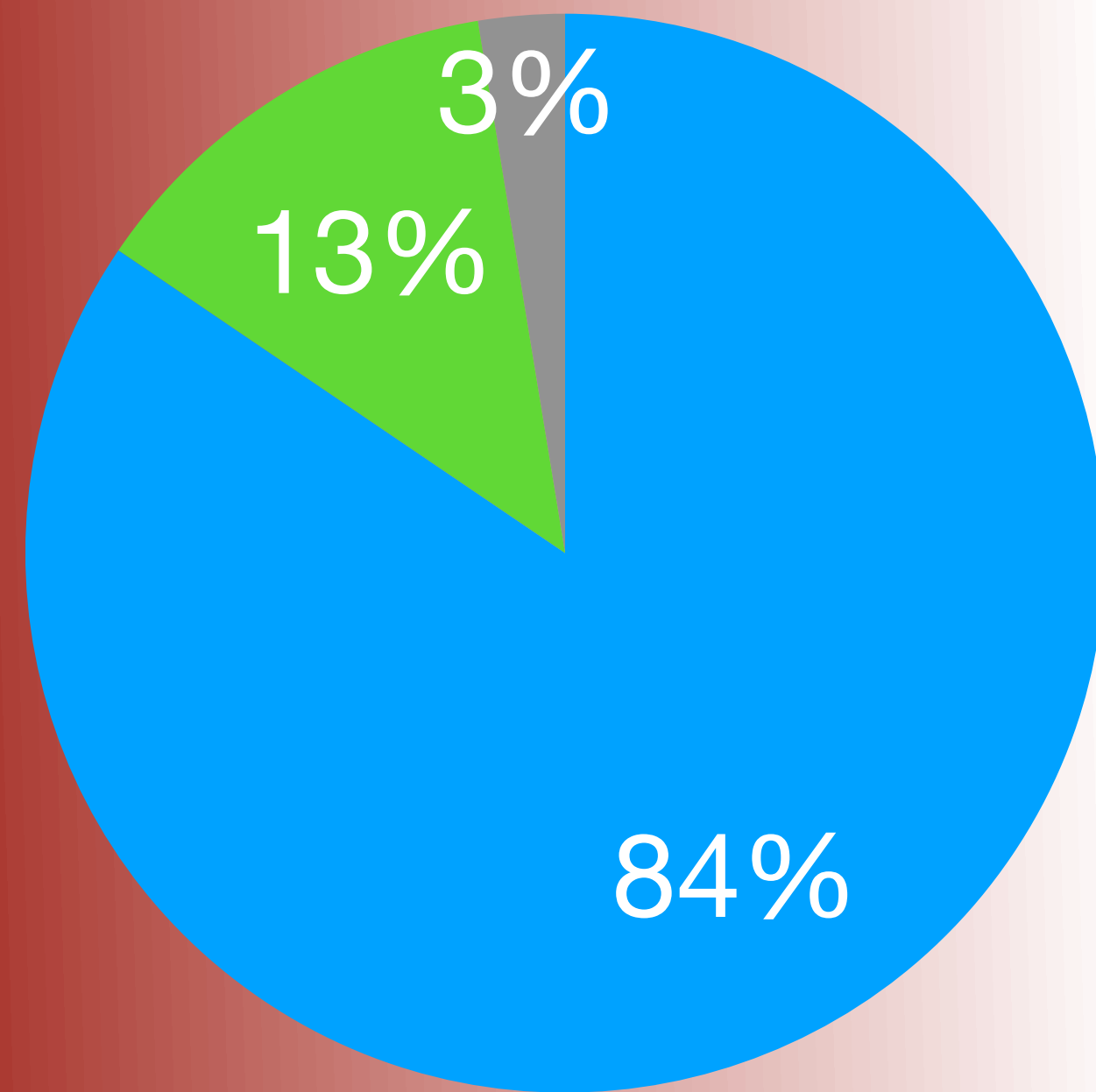

Major Legislation that Passed and Signed

HB 99 - Medical Malpractice Act Changes

HB 99 is a **liability-containment and system-stabilization bill**. It does **not dramatically change base caps**, but it:

- Tightens punitive damage rules
- Clarifies provider categories
- Improves long-term financial management of malpractice payouts

SB 2 - State Highway Project Bond

SB 2 is a **comprehensive transportation funding bill** that:

- Unlocks **large-scale highway investment (\$1.5B)**
- Shifts more costs to **road users (trucking, vehicle owners, EVs)**
- Strengthens long-term **financial stability of road funding**

HJM 2 - Task Force to Study Implementation of the Inspection of Public Records Act (IPRA)

HJM 2 directs the New Mexico Attorney General to convene a task force to evaluate the implementation and effectiveness of the IPRA and recommend potential legislative updates.
