Dear Ms. Laurent,

The purpose of this letter is to indicate my interest in serving on the Los Alamos Commerce and Development Corporation (LACDC) Board.

After I graduated from Los Alamos High School, I enjoyed working summers for a weekly newspaper called the Los Alamos Chronicle. Working on the paper was fast paced and invigorating. As part of a small team, you had to be willing to do any aspect of putting together a weekly paper. One facet I enjoyed immensely was getting to interact with the various retail businesses in Los Alamos on a weekly basis as I worked to both distribute the paper and solicit advertising. The Chronicle has long since faded away as a community newspaper. Sadly, many retail businesses in Los Alamos have disappeared as well. I am applying to the LACDC Board to do what I can to help reverse that trend.

After graduating from college, I joined a technology development company in Albuquerque (SEA Inc). I was fortunate to take part in the growth of that company from under 90 employees to over 550 employees before the company was sold to an international firm. During my tenure at the company, I became Vice President of Directed Energy systems. I concurrently served as President of SEA Technologies where I commercialized several products developed by the parent corporation. I also spun off my own company to manufacture and sell a successful counter surveillance technology. Through these endeavors I was actively involved in broader economic development activities in Albuquerque.

After the sale of SEA, my wife and I returned to our hometown of Los Alamos. I enjoyed a second half to my career at LANL serving as a Group Leader and Deputy Director for National Security and Defense. I also enjoyed being a volunteer for Los Alamos Visiting Nurse Service and serving on the selection committee for the LANL Employee Scholarship Fund.

I retired from LANL a few years ago, which has afforded me the time to get involved with NM economic development through Angel investing. I am currently a Board Member of the NM Angels, a Limited Partner in the NM Vintage Funds, and a strategic advisor to a VC firm and a NM based biotech company working with LANL. Through these endeavors I am doing a small part to help grow over 30 NM companies, including two that are based in Los Alamos. In addition, I have been involved with the LANL LEEP program serving as a liaison between the program entrepreneurs and the investment community.

The diversity of my background in economic development coupled with my deep understanding of the town of Los Alamos and LANL make me well suited to provide guidance and oversight to the LACDC. I have been very impressed with the good work that the LACDC and its subgroups have been doing over the years. I firmly believe that Los Alamos is on the verge of some dramatic, and very positive changes. I would like to help with that where I can.
