The Environmental Sustainability Board

Purpose: The Environmental Sustainability Board (ESB) was established to serve as the central point of contact for environmental sustainability issues and as an advisory body to the County Council on environmental sustainability issues

The ESB gathers and provides citizen input to staff and council on ways to improve the county's environmental sustainability

Review all environmental sustainability related matters submitted to the board by Council

The ESB serves as an advisory board to County Council for matters involving environmental sustainability

Authorization: The County Council adopted Ordinance 02-094 in June 2008 establishing the Environmental Sustainability Board. The scope of work was realigned on March 14, 2023, County Council voted that the ESB work with the new Sustainability Manager in support of implementing the recommendations of LARES. The charter language would not need to be changed but the Board staff Liaison would be the Sustainability Manager and ESB would then fall under the County Manager's Office for support.

ESB has four teams:

- Los Alamos Sustainability Alliance (formerly Zero Waste Los Alamos)
- Bee City Team
- Green Schools Task Force
- Bicycle Working Group

FY23 ESB Accomplishments

- Greatest accomplishment of the ESB was contributing as key stakeholders in Environmental Services municipal food waste composting feasibility study and recommending to County Council the implementation of a windrow composting program at Bayo Canyon and providing drop off collection points for residents and curbside collection for commercial customers. Council approved this recommendation in September 2022.
- Supported and provided recommendation to County Council for the Environmental Services Rate Proposal
- ESB contributed to the roll out of Operation Save the Bears the distribution of bear resistant dumpsters (260 or 100%) to businesses and carts to North Community 3 (480 or .06% of total county households)
- Continued supporting and monitoring implementation of the Yard Trimming Roll Cart Program to 75% of households (5,104) and diverted 884 tons of yard trimming material in 2022.
- Continued implementing Zero Waste Initiatives, which included:
 Maintained the Zero Waste Los Alamos Facebook group, published
 articles in PEEC Nature Notes as well as published monthly Zero Waste
 articles and tips focused on food waste prevention, backyard composting
 and other waste reduction methods.
- Contributed environmentally focused articles to 2023 Earth Day Tabloid
