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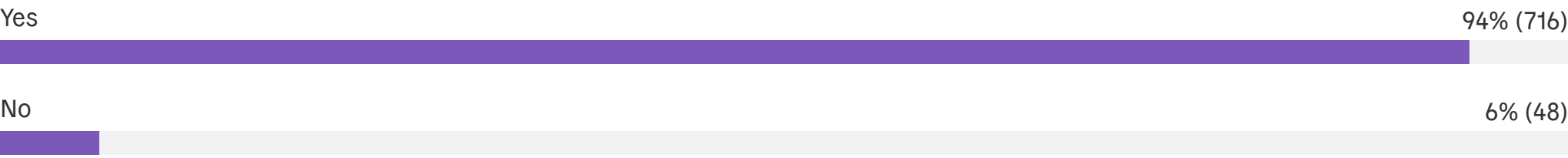

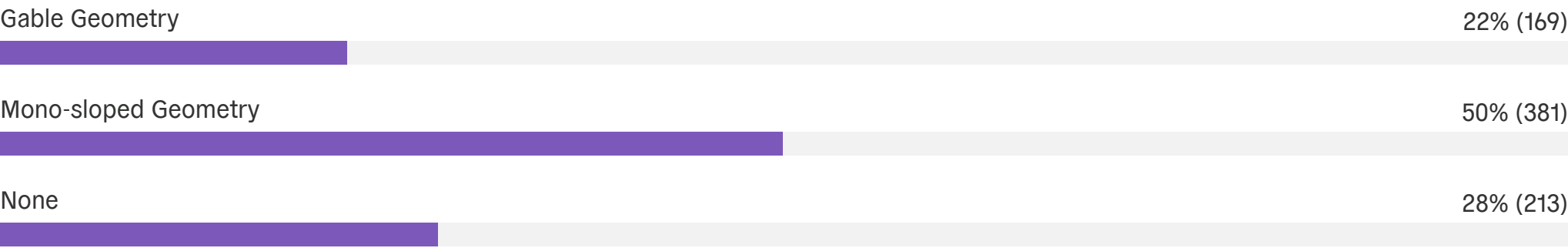

Why do we need shade for an outdoor sport that is meant to enjoy the sun and stars? It defeats the purpose. Just build an indoor rink if that's what you want.

A "shade structure" will likely be counterproductive if the goal is to keep the rink frozen with minimal energy use. Any gain from daytime shading of the extremely scarce sunlight in Los Alamos Canyon will likely be outweighed by the loss of radiative cooling to the open sky (did you know that water can freeze even if the air temperature is several degrees above 32 F if exposed to a sufficiently clear sky? The temperature of deep space is 3 Kelvin, after all.). Los Alamos is blessed with a thin, low-humidity atmosphere that makes such radiative cooling particularly effective. Before embarking on such an expensive project, you need to do some calculations and experiments to see if would even be helpful. Place some pans of water out in that already very shady canyon, one exposed to the open sky, and another under a picnic table, and see which one freezes first and stays frozen longest (it is too late in the season for this, but try it next winter). Consult with an engineer who specializes in thermal management and understands radiative heat transfer.

Covering the ice rink will change the whole experience of skating outdoors as has been the best part since its inception

Maintenance of county infrastructure that services EVERYONE in the county is more appropriate.

Pick whichever one is easier and/or cheaper to build and maintain.

Covering the rink will prevent it from radiating to the cold night sky to keep the ice firm. It will therefore increase the expense to keep the ice in place for most of the season.

This "shade structure" proposal is again prioritizing the needs of a few select recreational users (hockey players). The Los Alamos ice skating rink remains unique, and the open sky above represents an iconic, memorable aspect of the recreation experience. For the very small number of hockey players in the county, this structure adds value, but at an enormous cost per user. If the cost of this structure was applied to the admission rate, the facility would not be used. LA County parks and rec needs to acknowledge this outdoor rink for what it is, an outdoor rink, used seasonally, for recreational skating and occasional hockey. If heavy usage for hockey is desired, LA County needs to get serious about developing a Public Private Partnership to build a multi-use recreational facility, that includes an ice rink, that adequately burdens the users of such a facility heavy recreation activity.

I mean neither are really attractive, but the shade structure definitely needs to happen to I would choose Gable.

Housing for many needed much more; also revamping shopping area for more stores, restaurants

We need to concentrate on the roads in and out of our county than a cover for a few individuals. The road to White Rock up to Bandelier or the back gate is horrendous especially for Bike riders. It would destroy the rink's rarest and most outstanding distinction, of being an open-air ice rink in the desert southwest.
