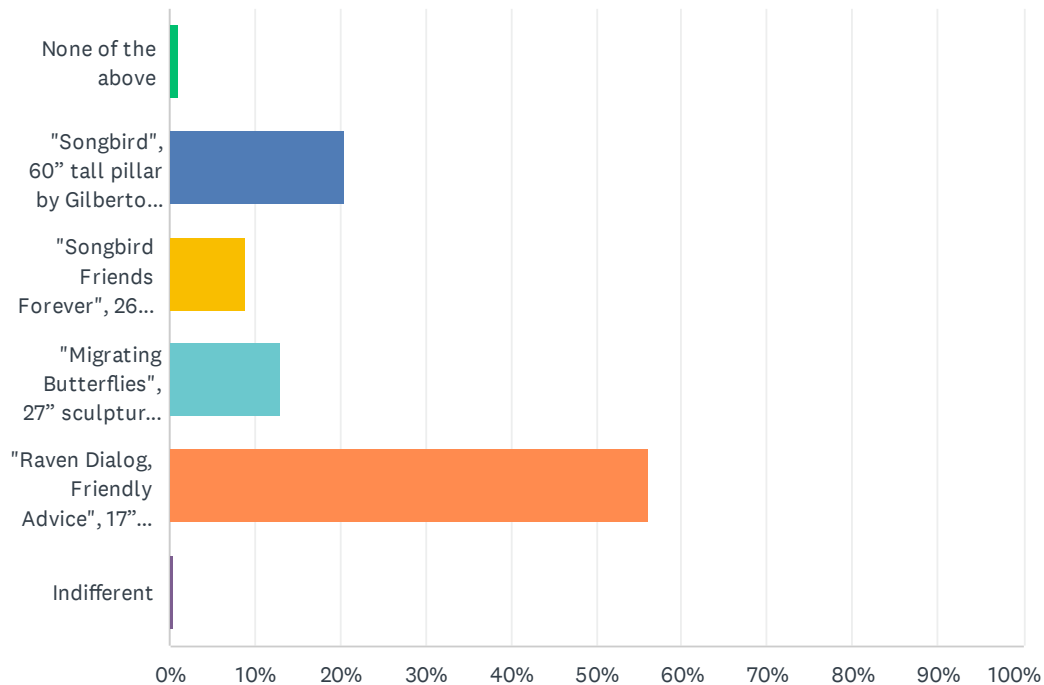


Q1 Which piece is your favorite?

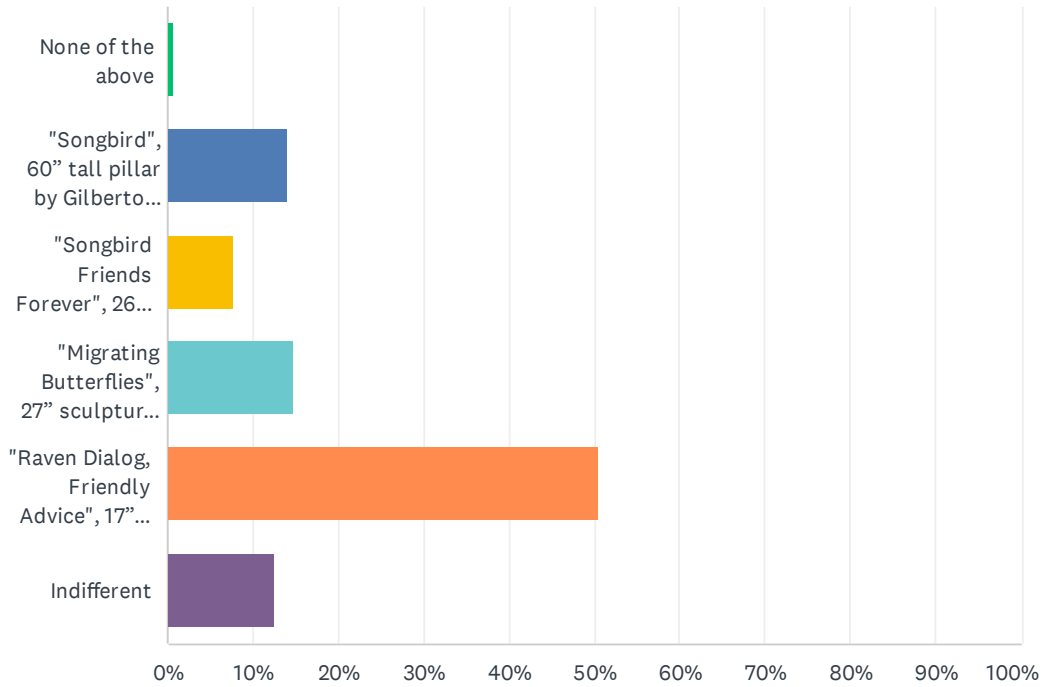

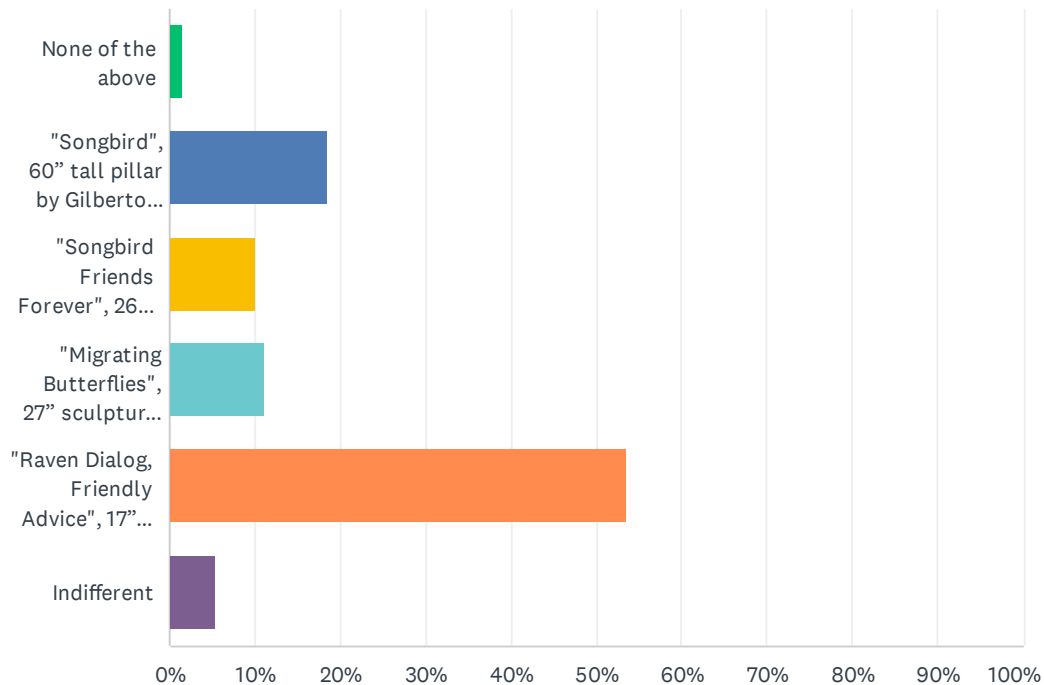

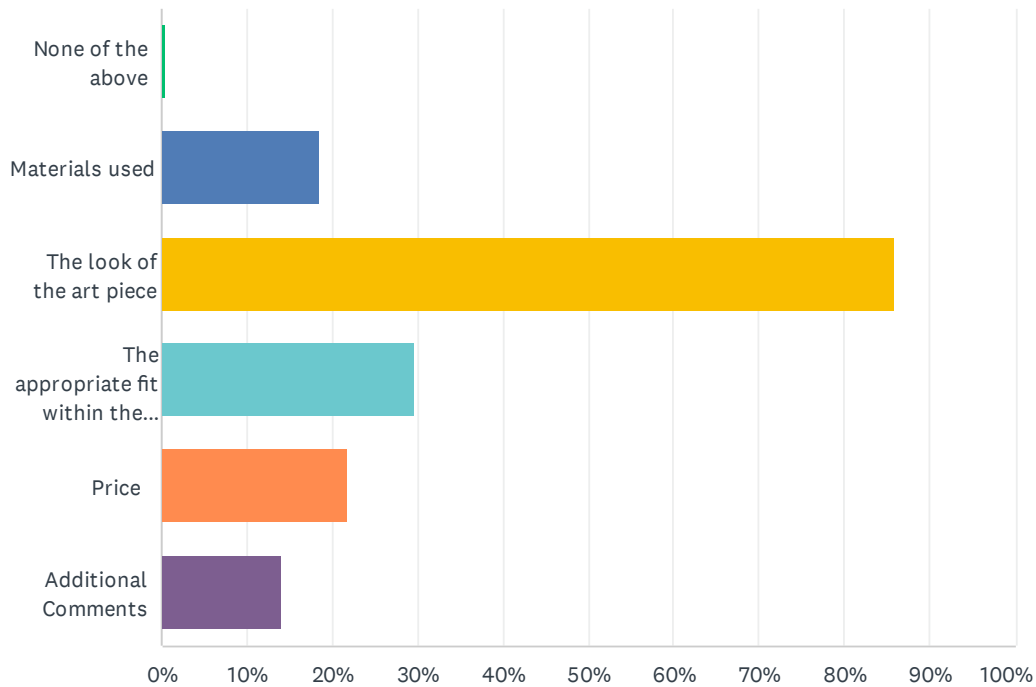
