- Lindsay lives in Albuquerque and has exhibited at many local galleries including Ghostwolf gallery, Tortuga gallery, Santa Fe community gallery, The Harwood Art Center, O.T. Circus gallery, Axe mobile art gallery, Coralles community library gallery and more.
- Lindsay has a bachelor's degree in studio art from St. Louis University.

Process

- Lindsay creates "yarn" by cutting fabric into long strips. Then she crochets the yarn into designs. She has created wearable items as well as functional carpets.


Space between two doors

- I have drawn sketches for art proposals for each area in the call for art. Each of my ideas offer simple and streamlined designs that will add comfort, softness and an artful touch to each space. I deliberately like the feeling of abstract, soft simplicity to add a calming touch to the atmosphere of the airport.
- The panels are handmade and offer the uniqueness of a created item that has not been manufactured by machine.
- Although I do not expect my art to be chosen for all the areas, I offered a design option for each space to show my ideas if the selection panel is interested in my idea for each space.
- The color scheme for my pieces can be customized to match the décor of the airport.
- There is also an option for airport staff and pilots to donate pieces of old (clean) clothing/fabric to be recycled and incorporated into the art to add a personal touch.

installment

- I would fasten each panel to a 2" x 4" board at the top and then bolt the board into the wall so that the panels can hang down. This is my current idea for installment, however if there is a better installation option, I am open to what works best for the space and function.

Maintenance

- The fabric panels will need to be cleaned periodically, however they are very durable and long lasting.

COST

- My current pricing proposal is \$100-\$120 per square foot of recycled crochet panel, depending on budget negotiations.
- For instance if there is a recycled crochet panel that is 15 square feet, the price would be between \$1500 and \$1800.
