Subject: Public input regarding allowing mobile food vending in Los Alamos County **Conducted by:** Los Alamos County, Los Alamos County Community Development Center

Summary: Breakdown of the survey.

Survey conducted for a month from October to November

654 people responded; majority of respondents were between the ages of 25-74

Over 60% (61.47% 402 people) would frequent a food truck 1-2 times a week

Over 40% (43.25% 282 people) have frequented a food truck 1-3 times a month within our community

Nearly 60% have frequented a food truck at Fairs/Special Events (67.29% 434 people), & Downtown/Street Corners (58.29% 376 people)

Nearly 80% (79.69% 514 people) prefer lunchtime over Nearly 55% (55.35% 357 people) prefer dinnertime

40% 227 people prefer food trucks to be restricted in residential areas, 25% 142 people prefer food trucks to be restricted near other food establishments, 181 people were in favor of no restrictions

75% would prefer food trucks offering New Mexican & International cuisine

90% 585 people consider food trucks to be a good way to test out new restaurant concepts in Los Alamos

Comment:

it's an excellent introduction to the community, and an excellent way to bring new options to Los Alamos. There isn't enough business to have new full time establishment restaurants, but food trucks could have enough clientele.

Absolutely! Some of my favorite restaurants in Austin and Albuquerque started out as food trucks.

Fully support more food trucks in Los Alamos. I think it would be a good idea for the county to provide a common area with outdoor seating and a kid's play area where several food trucks can congregate. It would create a nice atmosphere for families to eat out, and would provide multiple food options for families. Several places in Albuquerque do this and appear to be very successful.


We need more options in this town. Most restaurants don't stay open past 8. Younger crowds would love food trucks. Kids too.

Q1 What is your age?




Q2 Where do you mostly buy food from?







Q3 How many meals do you eat out in a typical week?





Q4 Historically, how often have you visited a food truck monthly?





Q5 Where do you usually visit mobile food vendors?






Q7 Should mobile food vending be restricted in certain areas?


Q8 Which types of food would you be most likely to purchase? (Check all that apply)






