	Council just approved 22 strategic priorities. Under Economics (scored low in community survey), tourism has been called out and reaffirmed commitment to Tourism. Per the community survey results, "more things to do" was identified as a community priority. Council will need to rely on BCCs to help track and implement community priorities. A good time to get community and business engagement needed to make things happen. The ultimate goal is to develop a dashboard to demonstrate progress.
