Proposal for a fountain to be installed at the White Rock Community Garden December 4, 2020

2. Artwork proposal:

The proposal is for a basalt fountain, with a solar-powered pump in an underground reservoir fed by the existing irrigation system at White Rock Community Garden. In the winter months, when the irrigation is unavailable, the solar pump for the fountain would be disengaged, and a plug for the fountain will convert it into a bird bath (a basin with water). In spring, the reverse operation will be performed. This seasonal system will allow for year-round enjoyment by both people and wildlife.

Specific location:

Location 3 seems most appropriate, with Location 1 also a possibility. Location 2 would be difficult to access without damaging the surrounding landscaping.

3. Title and specifications of the artwork:

Basalt Fountain by Mark Saxe

Dimensions: approximately 5 feet tall and 18" x 18"

Weight: approximately 1500 pounds
Basin: 48" in diameter and 12" deep

- 6. Technical requirements: Fountain will connect to existing irrigation system utilizing a self-regulating solar pump.

Access to site necessitates unobstructed 7' pathway for installation using forklift.

- 7. Lighting / landscaping needs: No special requirements in addition to those mentioned above.
- 8. Schedule of routine maintenance:

Routine maintenance would include yearly cleaning and introduction of anti-algae treatment formula.

Pump will be in a reservoir beneath the stone, with access for removal and cleaning.
