Carol Brown, National Nuclear Security Administration

The Supplemental Environmental Projects (SEPs) are derived from the January 22, 2016, Settlement Agreement between DOE, LANS, and New Mexico Environment Department (NMED).

Following the WIPP event DOE agreed to spend up to \$34.5M on 5 SEPs.

- Storm Water Engineering Structures (\$7.5M)
- Improvements to Transportation Routes used for Transportation of TRU waste to WIPP (\$12M)
- Water Line Improvement and Metering Upgrade (\$10M)
- Triennial Reviews (\$2.5M)
- Supplemental Sampling and Monitoring (\$2.5M)

These projects were jointly selected by NMED and DOE to benefit the Northern New Mexico Region. An additional investment of\$3.5 million by NNSA cleared the path for East Jemez/NM- 4 intersection upgrade to move forward. NA-LA is executing NM4/East Jemez Intersection via a Cooperative Agreement with NM Department of Transportation.

Start of construction for NM4/East Jemez Intersection anticipated to be Spring of

2022.

The project may extend over two construction seasons. Approximately 210 weather working days. National Park Service (NPS) anticipates constructing Tsankawi parking lot at the same time.

Coordination

- Project is funded by National Nuclear Security Administration
- New Mexico Department of Transportation will be managing the NM4/East Jemez Intersection project
- Coordination with the National Park Service parking lot at Tsankawi section of Bandelier National Monument

During construction, communication to the public will happen through a variety of venues.

<u>15202-21</u> Discussion And Possible Vote On Transportation Board Recommendation To Supply Matching Funds For Safety Improvements at Los Alamos Airport

A motion was made by Member Heavner seconded by Chair North, that the Transportation Board recommend that County Council supply the matching funds for the safety improvements at the airport.

Member Strickfaden and Jon Bulthuis added that the funds are part of the FY23 Federal Aviation Administration Grant and would include State funding.

A friendly amendment was made by Chair North to add "if practical" to the motion; the motion passed unanimously.

The Los Alamos County Transportation Board recommends to the County Council that, if practical, matching funds should be contributed to the safety improvements to the airport as outlined in the recent report submitted by Airport Manager Geoff Rodgers. We are advised the county's costs would soon be recovered, after which the airport may be expected to generate a modest profit instead of being an expense to the county. More important, it will better accommodate various safety roles including medical emergencies and fire, and better serve any needs of Los Alamos National Laboratory. It would also facilitate any development of commercial operations.

the LA RES report will strongly recommend as many vehicles as possible be replaced by electric vehicles, charging infrastructure and cost will also be discussed.
