# Proposal for Interactive Gate Design


# Meranda McDermott in collaboration with Art Fab Studio

We are honored to propose a thoughtfully designed, functional gate that transforms the stairwell entrance at the Betty Ehart Senior Activity Center into a work of art—one that resonates with curiosity, connection, and play. Drawing inspiration from the transient nature of this space and the community it serves, the design explores how individuals can experience both a sense of belonging and joyful discovery through movement, light, and form.

At its heart, this gate embodies the interwoven lives of the seniors, visitors, and children who pass through and gather at the center. Utilizing geometric forms inspired by children's foam puzzle mats and interlocking steel wires shaped into puzzle pieces, the artwork offers a subtle yet powerful metaphor: our lives are like puzzle pieces, distinct yet interconnected, constantly seeking alignment. As silhouettes move behind the gate, they animate the artwork, becoming part of the living "puzzle" and reminding us that people—and the spaces they inhabit—are shaped by presence and interaction.





The gate design features a bold yet inviting archway at its center, symbolizing passage, connection, and growth. This form invites individuals to step through and interact with the artwork while also providing a practical and visually captivating gateway. The structure combines steel wire—bent and interlocked into puzzle-piece shapes—with a geometric framework reminiscent of foam puzzle mats. The materials balance strength and familiarity: the tactile memory of childhood play and the enduring quality of steel are brought together, bridging generations.

The puzzle pieces, while playful in nature, carry layered meaning. They speak to the importance of connection—how individuals complete one another, how lives fit together in both planned and unexpected ways, and how even gaps in the "puzzle" can hold meaning and curiosity. The visual interaction of people moving behind the gate brings this concept to life.

Standing at 106 inches tall and 55.75 inches wide, the gate creates a striking frame



# **Technical Specifications & Installation Requirements**

#### **Materials**

The gate will be constructed primarily from steel sheeting and 3/32" stainless steel wire. Powder-coating will be applied for protection to ensure longevity, strength, and visual appeal.

#### Hardware

The design will incorporate standard gate hinges and hardware compatible with the County-supplied panic/crash bar.

#### Installation

The gate will be installed securely within the existing stairwell structure, with anchors and mounts specified for the material and location. We will coordinate with local contractors and Los Alamos County to ensure compliance with safety regulations and proper alignment of the panic bar.

Minimal site preparation is required. Any necessary modifications will be identified upon a site visit.

# **Project Timeline**

Contract Signature and Design Approval 2 weeks
Material Sourcing & Fabrication 8-10 weeks
Transportation & Installation 1 week

Total Project Duration: Approximately 11-13 weeks from approval.

# Maintenance & Safety

The gate will require minimal upkeep. An annual inspection for structural integrity and paint/coating wear is recommended. Minor cleaning with water and mild soap will maintain its appearance.

The gate will meet all safety codes, including emergency exit accessibility with the panic/crash bar. The design eliminates sharp edges and ensures smooth transitions between welded joints.

# **Estimated Budget**

The estimated cost range for the proposed artwork, including materials, fabrication, installation, and artist fees, is \$30,000

# **Budget Breakdown**

Materials: \$5,000 Fabrication: \$10,000 Installation: \$10,000 Contingency: \$5,000






